IMPORTANT DATES

July 13-19th – Summer Camp!

WHEN WE LEAVE

We will depart for the JN Webster Scout Camp in Conn. on SUNDAY, July 13, 2024 We will meet in front of the church, in the school yard at <u>TBD!!!!</u> Make sure you follow the instructions on what to wear and what to have handy for departure day.

WHAT TO WEAR TO CAMP

Each Scout will present themselves in their bathing suit and a tee-shirt, have their scout shirt on a hanger, have their spending money out, and any medicines they take, in a Ziploc bag with his name, Troop 6 Quincy, and Site: TBD. It is a LAW that the Camp Nurse administers all medications and if your scout has an EpiPen or asthma inhaler, you need to fill out the form for them to be able to carry it. The Camp doesn't care that your scout takes their own medicine at home.

HOW DOES THE SPENDING MONEY WORK?

The Troop Leaders hold all spending money in a 'bank'. Your scout may withdraw as much as necessary for Scouting kits, books, etc. They will be given only enough for a can of soda and a candy bar each day, until their money runs out. We suggest around \$30. On Saturday morning, the accounts are closed and any money not spent is turned over to your scout or returned to their account. Many scouts have already earned \$30 spending money through participation in the bottle drives.

WHAT ABOUT MEALS?

We will most likely stop for lunch on our way out on Sunday and the remainder of the meals are provided as part of the camp fee. The last meal the Scouts eat with us is Saturday Breakfast.

WHEN DO THE SCOUTS GET BACK?

We should arrive back at the Church around 11:30 AM. on Saturday, July 19th. Please be there to greet them. They will be tired and will need a ride home. We will send an email and/or call when we know what our exact ETA is.

CAMP FEES

The fee for camp this year is \$610. The money is due no later than June 30th. If you want to use money in your scout account, please send me an email to authorize the withdrawal. This fee includes a Troop Photograph, which is a wonderful memento of the week. It also covers our pig roast, merit badge books, badges, and other items that the Troop provides. There is a \$200 payment due by June 2nd. This deposit can come from the scout accounts, if there is enough money. Scout parents must confirm that their scout is going before May 1st or the fees will increase to \$635.

CAMP PHYSICALS

This is the most painful part of camp prep every year! We need your physical form filled out, signed by a physician and **a copy of your medical insurance card**. These are required by June 30th as well. There are also forms for inhalers, epi-pens, and food allergies as necessary.

CAN I WRITE TO MY SCOUT OR SEND THEM STUFF?

The answer is yes, except for food. No food is permitted in the tents--this is the woods and there are animals that will search it out....the address is:

WILL MY SCOUT CALL HOME?
