As fall rapidly approaches, which our recent cool weather is reminding us of, some of our best riding will be coming up right around the corner. The beauty of our Northwoods color will soon be abundant and what better way to enjoy it than to take a ride on our many forest roads and trails.

## **Membership**

Our membership currently totals 422, approximately the same as last year. However, machine licensing continues to increase, so by all rights we also should be seeing a continuing growth in our membership numbers.

I am not sure why we are not, unless the new owners do not understand that road use is contingent upon a club sponsoring it. If you do not see a club sticker on their machine it only takes a casual hello, where are you from, do you belong to a club, would you like to join our club, type casual conversation to see if they would be interested in joining our club.

## <u>Trail and Route Status</u>

## **Hwy Q-Dump Road to Old 26**

While our early spring weather certainly did not help in working on this trail, the good news is that trail construction is done, and the trail is now open for your use. An updated map of the PRF Trail System is attached for your reference.

In addition, there is some much-needed brushing north of the trail and east towards highway 45. I am going to reach out to the Hodag Snowmobile Club and see if they can come in and brush it for us as it is a snowmobile trail in winter and they would brush it before their season starts. Hopefully I can get them to come in early and do this for us.

Old 26 road west off Highway 45 and south to the north Dump Road gate is in need of some fill and grading. This is an unmanaged, unmaintained town road so the town does not receive any road use tax money. I reached out to the Conservation Fund and the Town of Schoepke and they all have agreed to work with the club and share in the fill and doing the grading.

However, the Conservation Fund did request a project plan and estimated cost before committing any actual monies or support. I will be working on this in the near future, and we would anticipate doing actual trail work next spring.

#### Hwy 45/Cemetery Road to McGinnis Road -Town of Schoepke

Work has begun on this trail with the county highway department doing the tree cutting and brushing. We were fortunate that the Department of Transportation approved a width variance for a small segment of the trail which helped make this trail happen.

Over the next couple weeks they will be adding the gravel, doing the grading and putting the black top landing in on Cemetery Road. Once complete, that trail will be open to McGinnis Road and the Yamaha/Romsa trail.

As stated in previous newsletters, this  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile trail is a critical connecting point where the 35 MPH Speed Limit ends on Hwy 45 to McGinnis Rd and the Romsa/Yamaha Trail. We are extremely pleased that we will have this completed shortly.

#### ATV/UTV Access Pelican River Forest-The Conservation Fund/DNR Recreational Easement

This is just a reminder the forest roads are open up to County Highway C in Starks, just east of Rhinelander.

What this means is that the trail from Dump Rd/Old 26 to Leith Rd, across Hwy 8 to Town Rd, to a forest road up to Rasmussen Rd and then to County Hwy C east of Rhinelander is available to use and provides for an alternate route into the Rhinelander area. (See updated map)

These privately owned forest roads and trails are open annually from June 1<sup>st</sup> to December 1<sup>st</sup> based on contractual agreements with the DNR and The Conservation Fund.

## **Hwy 45/Musky Mart Trail**

We were fortunate that an asphalt company was referred to us by Kerry Romsa and gave us an extremely reasonable bid of \$3000 to put in asphalt landings on Hwy 45 crossing by County Hwy B as well as by the trail where it comes out on Manitowoc Street in Pelican Lake.

While it took some scrambling to obtain the necessary permits from the Department of Transportation, they were very cooperative with me on approving this in advance of a formal permit. My appreciation goes out to Rich Handrick in the department for working with me on this expedited approval so the work could get done at such reasonable cost.

By the time you receive this newsletter, this work should be complete.

#### **Highway 8 Wayside Trail**

Unfortunately our request for funding of this trail was not approved at the Off Road Vehicle Council meeting in August. They were short on funds and focused most grants to trail rehabilitation projects, versus new trail development.

We will resubmit the request after the first of the year and hope that additional funding will be available.

## Equipment Status

Our Massey Tractor was thoroughly gone over by a certified dealer and after a couple of follow up incidentals we have it now in good working order except for a leak which the dealer will repair when we are done with our fall grading.

Thanks to Dennis Vanden Huevel for taking on the task of watching over the repairs, as well as taking care of the rest of our equipment.
