Membership

<u>Trail and Route Status</u>

Hwy 45 Trail from County B Crossing to Musky Mart Crossing

New Enterprise Forest Trail

Work continues to progress on the trail, 2 of the bridges are now installed, 2 are on site ready for installation, and one is still under construction. The Oneida County Forestry Department may be asking us to do additional brushing and clean-up work, as well as help in setting the gate posts in place in concrete footings. Hwy 45 thru Pelican Lake

With a recent change in state law we now have an opportunity to work with the Town of Schoepke to see if they would be in favor of allowing ATV/UTV traffic on Hwy 45 thru town between Highways B and Q. In order to do this though, we would also need to have the Department of Transportation change where the 55 MPH Speed Limits start as you leave the 35 MPH speed limits. We will be discussing this further with the Town of Schoepke at the next town meeting.

In the meantime, DO NOT DRIVE ON HWY 45 in Pelican Lake

Lost Lake Road to Cty D and Hummers, New White Lake Bridge

Rus Cook from the Parrish Highlanders has updated me the following: The trails from Post Lake, Wi to L'il Hummers and Augustyn Springs via Lost Lake Rd are now open again but like Rus always has said, "respect the trails you ride on or they may close due to lack of respect". Thanks to the Wolf River riders of Pearson WI, for their diligent effort to get this reopened. Also the new trail from Summit Lake to Augusytn Springs is open and it will take you to White Lake, WI & beyond. Our thanks go out to Rus and the Parrish Highlanders ATV club for their effort in getting this new trail open.

The White Lake club has been working on getting a bridge built across the Wolf River, in the town of Langlade, WI, Township of Wolf River. This winter this bridge was approved by the state for the 2nd time in 8 years. First time it was approved there was a state budget cut in 2012. Now in 2018 it was approved again to be built. Hopefully the bridge will be built to take us across Hwy 55 to join us up with the state trail to UP of Michigan & to the south to Suring, WI and beyond. This bridge will be multi-use, snowmobile in winter season, ATV/UTV in spring & late fall, also open to bikers & hikers thru summer & fall months. Thanks to White Lake ATV/UTV Club & Wisc. ORV council this is in the works for the future of ATVers.

Maps

The maps are currently at the printer and we hope to have them in about two weeks. We will have to make up map boxes for them and then distribute them to the appropriate business members. Maps will cost \$2.00 each, and they cover to the North up to the Town of Pelican, Hwy P, to the West to the Lincoln County line including the Enterprise Forest Trail System, to the East to Mole Lake and to the South to just south of Summit Lake. Trailer Update

The club trailer has been ordered and we expect it in about 4-5 weeks, after which we will need to put the club logo on it and the inside shelving. We chose a 16 foot trailer, aluminum sides, two side doors, loading ramp rear door, dual axle.

Safety

It still continues to amaze the officers of your club how many people do not know the basic hand signals to be used when riding on the trail, or the age and helmet law requirements for riding in or operating an ATV or UTV, or what a speed limit means.

We cannot emphasize enough our commitment to safe, legal, lawful riding and participation in our sport. We all realize the enjoyment we get out of a ride, so let's make it a club commitment to make it as safe as possible.

As a reminder here are the DNR requirements for operating or riding in an ATV or UTV

ATV/UTV Age Rule

All ATV operators at least age 12 and UTV operators age 16 and born on or after January 1, 1988 must possess a valid ATV safety certificate issued by this state or any other state or province. Operators must be in possession of this certificate while operating in areas open to the public such as trails, routes and frozen waterways and display it to a law enforcement officer upon request. Certified operators may transport other passengers. ATV Safety Institute (ASI) certificates are not valid in Wisconsin.

All ATV safety certified operators age 12-15 must also be accompanied by an adult while operating on a designated ATV Route (this means any road used by motor vehicles)

Small UTV Rule

Children age 12 – 15 years may operate small UTVs (200 ccs or less) on public, off-road ATV trails only. The child may cross roads at trail crossings, however no operation is allowed on designated ATV Road Routes. The child must be accompanied by a designated adult and possess a valid ATV Safety Certificate.

Helmet Requirements

All ATV/UTV operators and passenger under the age of 18 are required to wear a minimum DOT standard ATV or motorcycle helmet. Bicycle helmets do not meet this requirement.

Helmets for Passengers:

If circumstances would require you to wear a helmet as the operator then you, as a passenger, must wear a helmet.

Speed Limits and Pavement Regulations

The maximum speed limit for ATV's and UTV's on Road Routes is the posted speed limit of the road, however your speed cannot exceed 35 MPH regardless if the road speed limit is greater than 35 MPH. Please obey this basic rule, the easiest way for us to lose our privilege of driving on the road routes is to exceed the speed limit.

In addition, at all times you are required to keep your ATV or UTV on the pavement, do not ride on the shoulder of the road. If a vehicle is trying to pass you wait until you can pull over at an intersection or there is a safe passing zone for the vehicle.

Hand Signals

There are specific hand signals to use when riding on the trails, they are there for not only your safety, but the safety of your fellow riders who are sharing the same trails. Please familiarize yourself with them and use them when riding, they are on the last page of this newsletter.

Safety and Courtesy

We have noticed, as some of you may have, that some riders do not use the appropriate hand signals. Now we do not know if these are club members or not, but as a courtesy and reminder to our members please refer to the below for the proper hand signals.

ATV/UTV Hand Signals: It is important for riders to communicate with each other while their vehicles are moving. Using hand signals while riding will help people around you know what you are doing and where you are going, which ultimately leads to a safer ride.


Left Turn
