Trail and Route Status

Just a note, our ATV trails typically open on May 22nd. However, the opening date is as we know somewhat weather dependent. It is in the realm of possibility that a late spring thaw could delay our normal opening. Please watch our Facebook page for updates as opening season nears.

New Enterprise Forest Trail

Unfortunately with the heavy snowfalls we have had this winter it has impacted the progress on this trail. In my last conversation with the Forestry Director, John Bilogan, he stated that the trail will not be ready for opening with the balance of our trail system. They were still laying gravel down well into January, before the heavy snow began. The heavy snow throughout the month of February and since then has prohibited them from finishing the graveling of the trail. It just became too costly to continually plow the trail base and roads leading to their gravel pits. Graveling the remaining trail segments, and signing will be the work that needs to be completed in June.

His best estimate is the new Trail will be ready for opening around the middle to end of June. When it does open, it will be required of the club to have the ability to provide maintenance and monitoring of it for tree windfall, etc. With that said we will need an "on call" group of individuals for trail maintenance issues, etc., as well as one or two trail ambassadors. If you have an interest in either of these areas please let Gene or I know as soon as possible.

Hwy 64 Wolf River Langlade Bridge

While not in our area of responsibility, it is worthy of mention that our fellow clubs have finally succeeded in gaining the approval and grant to build a bridge across the Wolf River in the Town of Langlade on Highway 64. Our thanks go out to the following for working so hard to expand ATV/UTV Trail access across our adjoining counties: Parrish Highlanders, Red Arrow ATV & Snowmobile club of Oconto, White Lake ATV Club, Wolf River Riders ATV club, Dusty Trails ATV club, Bear Paw ATV Club as well as 300 plus people who showed up at a Langlade County meeting to support this project.

<u>Maps</u>

Jeff Herman and Tim Wolfgram have been working hard over winter on updating our club maps, as well as obtaining business sponsors and renewals. The new maps will be available at the local businesses or from one of the Board Members. They are \$2.00 each and cover the area between Summit Lake and the Town of Pelican, Rhinelander as well as from the Oneida/Forest County Line to the Enterprise Forest Trail System, including the new trail in Enterprise Forest Block. Hopefully we may also have them ready for our annual meeting.

<u>Closing</u>

As our season is rapidly coming upon us, now is the time to go over your machine to make sure it is trail ready for riding.

*Reinstall the battery if you removed it for storage, and charge it fully. Be sure the battery holds a charge. *If you did not change the oil and oil filter before storing the ATV, do so now.

*Check the spark plugs, and replace them if necessary.

*Fill the fuel tank with fresh gasoline, and make sure the engine starts.

*Check all the lights, and replace any burned-out bulbs.

*Check the tires for damage and inflate them. Tires may wear or flatten if left on the ground for long periods of time.

*Check for damage caused by rodents, such as blocked pipes or chewed wires and cables.

*Check for any other damage that may occur during storage. For example, parts made of rubber or plastic may deteriorate over time.

And two of the most important items to check

*Is your registration current?

*Refresh your memory on Wisconsin ATV/UTV Rules and Regulations, as well as all of the courtesy hand signals.
