Trail and Route Status

Just a note, Oneida County ATV trails typically open on May 22nd. Langlade County Trails typically open May 1, 2020, weather permitting. This includes the Parrish Highlands, Augustyn Springs, Pickerel/Pearson, Antigo and the White Lake/Elton ATV trail systems

However, the opening date is as we know somewhat weather dependent. It is in the realm of possibility that a late spring thaw could delay our normal opening. Please watch our Facebook page for updates as opening season nears.

New Enterprise Forest Trail

Our new trail opened in July and we hope that you have had a chance to take a ride and check it out, it certainly turned out better than expectations and with the terrain, and crossing a beautiful creek it is a very picturesque ride, and provides for another option to head towards the Lincoln Country trails, making a nice loop so one is no longer back tracking on the same trail.

With this new trail though, does come the club's responsibility to maintain it, removing overgrown brush, larger rocks, watching for washouts, maintaining signage, etc. The club is reimbursed through the state's ATV Trail Maintenance program for labor hours and equipment usage that is expended to keep the trail in good, safe riding condition. If you would like to volunteer to help in this please let a board member know.

Dump Road to Monico-Monico to Forest County Line

The Oneida County Forestry Dept. has been doing preliminary work on the Monico to Forest County Line leg of this trail. However, they also have a multitude of requests from the other ATV/UTV Clubs in the county for development of trails in those areas as well so it becomes a matter of prioritization of all of these requests, identifying which ones should be worked on when.

The problem we have, as most of you know, is that for us to establish a trail from Pelican Lake to Monico we have to use the old Dump Road in the Town of Schoepke on the north side of the lake. After numerous conversations, again, with Forest Land Group, and with some changing of requirements on their end, we still have an agreement in principal to work together on opening this trail up, unfortunately though the devil is in the details of such agreement.

Towards the end of last year, Forest Land Group requested a meeting between our club, themselves, and Oneida County Forestry Department. Unfortunately timing of the various groups involved did not work out, plus with the uncertainty of leadership at the Oneida County Forestry Department at that time the meeting was postponed until 2020.

The development of this trail would be an extensive undertaking for the club, and involves potential significant expense as well as easement negotiation. A rough cost estimate for this project would range in the area of \$50,000 to \$75,000 depending on final arrangements with Forest Land Group and DNR Requirements.

Hwy 45 Right of Way

In working with the Town of Schoepke, the two options would be to use the ROW or ride on Hwy 45. The latter was not a favorable choice due to safety reasons, the former has some significant issues to resolve with the DOT.

After a meeting with the Town, the DOT, DNR and State Representatives, we thought we were making some progress on using this old railroad ROW only to find at the end of the year the DOT actually came back with even more restrictive requirements to develop this than what they started with. In pursing conversation with them they were to do some additional work and coordination and report back to us last fall, unfortunately we have not heard any response to date since then.

A rough cost estimate for this project could run anywhere from \$11000 to \$45000 depending upon final DOT/DNR requirements.

Because of the potential expense exposures these projects present to the club, we believe that both of these should be a key topic at our Annual Meeting and the decision to continue any further should not be made without the input of our membership. Please try to attend the meeting, but if you cannot yet still would like to offer your opinion please let me know.

Rhinelander Access

Great news, thanks to the hard work and diligent effort of Paul Hagan, member of our club, and President of the Hodag 4-Wheelers, all county highways leading into Rhinelander are now open for ATV/UTV use. Please obey all laws, and remember Lincoln and Stevens Street are the two streets *that are not open to ATV/UTV use.*

<u>Maps</u>

2019-2020 Maps are available at the local businesses or from one of the Board Members. They are \$2.00 each and cover the area between Summit Lake and the Town of Pelican, Rhinelander as well as from the Oneida/Forest County Line to the Enterprise Forest Trail System, including the new trail in Enterprise Forest Block. Maps are updated every other year.

Oneida County ATV/UTV Council

Special thanks to Jeff Herman and Tim Wolfgram for representing our club to this Council. It appears it to be well on its way to accomplishing what Gene and I envisioned when we first proposed the idea to the county. To date they have defined geographic boundaries of each of the clubs so we are not duplicating effort, and currently the council is identifying all club projects which will then be prioritized with the Forestry Department.

The cost for the tractor will be covered thru the trail maintenance reimbursement received from the state, as well as secondary income should the Hodag Club wish to have us grade their trails as well.

<u>Closing</u>

Just a reminder as we did from last year, as our season is rapidly coming upon us, now is the time to go over your machine to make sure it is trail ready for riding.

*Reinstall the battery if you removed it for storage, and charge it fully. Be sure the battery holds a charge.

*If you did not change the oil and oil filter before storing the ATV, do so now.

*Check the spark plugs, and replace them if necessary.

*Fill the fuel tank with fresh gasoline, and make sure the engine starts.

*Check all the lights, and replace any burned-out bulbs.

*Check the tires for damage and inflate them. Tires may wear or flatten if left on the ground for long periods of time.

*Check for damage caused by rodents, such as blocked pipes or chewed wires and cables.

*Check for any other damage that may occur during storage. For example, parts made of rubber or plastic may deteriorate over time.

And two of the most important items to check

*Is your registration current?

*Refresh your memory on Wisconsin ATV/UTV Rules and Regulations, as well as all of the courtesy hand signals. For more information please refer to the following link https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/atv/
