Silver City Emergency Plan, Updated 2025

- 1. Please stay as calm as possible.
- 2. Ring Bell or Manual Fire Alarm at store or water shed or repeatedly honk your car horn three (3) times pause and repeat pattern until help arrives.
- 3. Meet at the Silver City Store deck. (See Wildfire Evacuation Plan, Meeting Points and Communication Hub)
 - a. The deck will be the center for information, and the leader will have a plan on how to proceed.
 - b. Follow the instructions of the leader who will be in contact with emergency personnel and other communication hubs. (Cold Springs and Mineral King)
- 4. In the case of a structure/cabin fire:
 - a. Remember it takes a team to fight the fire!
 - b. Everyone will have a role and most of these are support
 - c. Alert the store and all occupied cabins.
- 5. Fighting a structure fire:
 - a. Yours and others SAFETY must come first! Get help first!
 - b. NEVER enter a building. We are a volunteer team and are not equipped or trained to enter a burning structure.
 - c. Try to contain the fire to the structure and protect surrounding structures and trees.
 - d. If you are wearing synthetic clothing, **do not fight the fire**, as your clothes may melt and create another emergency. Either change clothes or be a support person.
- 2. Leaving your cabin (See Evacuation Checklist):
 - a. Close all the windows and doors in your cabin.
 - b. Turn OFF propane at the tank.
 - c. Turn OFF all water service valves to the cabin except *The Fire Hose System: It will remain charged.* (You may be instructed to leave all water valves to cabin open.)
- 3. In the case of an evacuation of Silver City: (See Wildfire Action Plan for Definitions of Warnings and Evacuations)
 - a. Stay put at the resort until notified.

Do not automatically go downhill as emergency vehicles will be coming up the hill!

- b. If a fire is below Silver City, plan to evacuate up the hill and meet at the designated evacuation area on map (*Meeting Points and Communication Hub: Cold Springs Ranger Station or Mineral King*) There are fewer things to burn there, and this is considered a safer area.
 - **It is also close to the helicopter pad. **
- c. Only if there is no other option should we go downhill. In this case we should meet at the Atwill Mill camping parking lot or Atwell Ranger Station.
- 4. What to bring. Bring only the clothes on your back and any important paperwork or pictures that you can carry in your pockets. Or grab your premade emergency backpack. (*Emergency Pack Details, see Evacuation Checklist*)
 - a. Bring bandana, handkerchief, mask for covering your mouth and filtering smoke. (This should be in your premade emergency pack: N95 mask and eye goggles for smoke) If you are helicoptered out they (Park Service) will not take personal belongings....and unfortunately that includes pets.
