1. SB 951 Increase payments of state disability to 90%
2. AB 988 Funds call centers for mental health lines
3. SB 1338 would allow compelling mentally ill to mental care facilities.
4. AB Farm workers can vote by mail
5. CA\$ A constitutional amendment that will restore the rights of parents to give property to children
