



We here at Bryce Canyon Mule Days want you to know we have done everything to stay safe and healthy since the outbreak of COVID-19 in the United States. **After much deliberation, and meeting with Garfield County Commissioners and the Mayor of Tropic, we have decided to move forward with Bryce Canyon Mule Days as scheduled.** We hope you will use your best judgement to either cancel or join us in Tropic May 6-9.

We are ready to get back in the saddle and enjoy the wide-open spaces and red rocks of southern Utah.

This year, we have more open camp sites than we ever have had in years prior. This will give guests more room to spread out. We also have fewer attendees this year, which will help with social distancing.

Currently, 20 guests have cancelled due to the virus. This means groups will be limited to 3-4 people plus guides. You're encouraged to drive yourself to the trailhead while we transport your mule to and from the trails each day.

All trails planned are still open and will remain open for Bryce Canyon Mule Days.

The facility will be cleaned and sanitized throughout the day to remain safe for all users.

The group dinner has been cancelled. The concert featuring Utah country artist Brenn Hill will still be held, but this year it will be outside with plenty of room to keep a safe distance from others.

We ask participants to also practice safe measures during these times — wash your hands, use hand sanitizer, don't touch your face, sneeze and cough into your elbow, and keep 6 feet between you and others. If you feel sick or have been around someone that was sick, do not come. We will gladly refund your reservation and look forward to seeing you next year.
