Ionopsis

Bonpland & Kunth 1816

Pronunciation:

eye-oh-NOPP-siss (click on the name to hear it spoken)

Tribe: Maxillarieae Subtribe: Oncidiinae

One of the "twig epiphytes" *lonopsis*, depending on who you ask, can be considered relatively easy or extremely difficult to keep alive. *I. utriculariodes* is probably the most well-known of the approximately 10 species. The genus was described in 1815 and is allied to Comparettia. It was named after two Greek words, ion (violet) and opsis (appearance) in reference to the flowers which somewhat resemble violets (Viola). Although appearing pseudobulbless, lonopsis is characterized by very short, small pseudobulbs which are hidden by the base of the clasping leaves. The small, dainty flowers are white or white with violet or a pale lavender-pink with violet stripes and are produced in large numbers so that a well grown plant is a feast for the eye.

Number of species:

The World Monocot Checklist contains 6 accepted names (7/2009).

Distribution:

Tropical and subtropical Americas from Florida and Mexico to Brazil and Bolivia

Temperature:	Warm growing; minimum temperatures 53-59F (12-15C)
Light:	Moderate shade. In South Florida, they could be seen in old orange groves.
Water- Humidity:	Moderate shade. In South Florida, they could be seen in old orange groves.
Fertilizer:	Monthly with a 1-1-1 ratio.
Potting:	Best grown mounted on a twig or small slabs of treefern or cork.
