Plant drop off for the show will be this week at our meeting. Pick up time and location will be announced once it's finalized.

The plant registration article Jill wrote is included in the culture corner section. If you need assistance with any of your plants, the experienced members will be there and ready and able to help.

Plant Preparation

Make sure your plants are looking their best for the display and judging.

- 1) Remove old dead spikes and dried sheaths. Basically, if it is brown and crunchy remove it if possible. If you have questions about whether or not something can or should be removed, hold off and ask one of the veteran growers at the upcoming meeting.
- 2) Stake any flower spikes or growths for the best presentation. Staking not only helps support the flower spike and help prevent it from bending or snapping when being moved, but it also helps to display the flowers at their best. Any unruly growths can also be wired/staked upright to give a more pleasing appearance to the eye.
- 3) Check for pests. The time to treat your plants has passed. If you are looking at your plants and find any sort of live bug on them, leave them at home. Plants will be inspected prior to adding them to the display. It does not matter how pretty the flowers are, any plant found to have an infestation of any kind will be excluded to protect the health of all the other plants. Please, just do not bring plants with bugs.
- 4) If you are unsure how to spruce up your plant to get it show ready, there will be many people at the meeting who are willing to help. Many times people often bring emergency supplies such as some extra stakes and ties.

“Name” is alphabetized by the Name of the Intergeneric and “Abbrev” is alphabetized by abbreviation. These are great for deciphering plant labels at any time.

The International Orchid Register / RHS Gardening

Not sure if your Hybrid is registered? Have a named hybrid and want to know the parents? The search function will help you. Remember that if the seed and pollen parents are reversed then it is still the same registered hybrid so search both ways if you think the hybrid is registered.

Plants of the World Online | Kew Science

Have the taxonomists been changing names of your species and not nice enough to come over and update your plant labels? This site has the latest information on what it is called and every other synonym.

Orchidroots, home of orchids and selected plants and animals.

While this is not an official site for information, it can be a good reference if you know the hybrid name and want the parents and species composition information.

Remember that help is available. You can bring always bring questions to the meetings for assistance. If you do not have tags available, writing your list with the tag information will help the person doing registration at the show greatly.

Examples

Phalaenopsis amboinensis

Name – Phalaenopsis amboinensis

Parents – not applicable since this is a species (we know this is a species since the Grex is lowercase)

Class – 48 (By searching for Phalaenopsis in the MAOC Classification list it shows us that Species are in class 48 and Hybrids are in classes 49-62)

Paph Cocoa Oliver x Cocoa Green

Name – Paphiopedilum Southernwood's Green Sapphire (Paph is the abbreviation for Paphiopedilum and the Name is found by searching by the parents on RHS)

Cross – Paph Cocoa Oliver x Paph Cocoa Green

Class – 37-42 (Paphiopedilum hybrids are in classes 31-42 per the MAOC Classification List and then the Show Schedule indicates that Complex Paphiopedilum Hybrids are in classes 37-42. Reviewing the flower color would get to the final class number)

Other items to remember

- Let's name those NOIDs..."Phal NOID – Cat Stole the Tag", "Bulbophyllum NOID – Stupid Squirrels", or "Oncidium NOID – Yellow Fireflies"
- In most cases plants are judged in order by class number. When debating between class numbers, register it in the lower class number and the judging team can move it to a higher class number if applicable.
- If you are entering more than 1 plant with the same name please add a '(#)' after the name of the plant.

JUDGING CENTER DETAILS

The AOS's judging system comprises 27 judging centers. The centers provide opportunities for the public to have plants judged on specified monthly dates. Center activities are open to visitors who wish to see the judging process in operation or bring in plants to be evaluated. Orchid plants can be submitted for judging using the following guidelines:

- All blooming orchid plants or cut flowers submitted at a monthly judging session are candidates for awards.
- Candidates should be entered in the most presentable condition possible.
- Candidates may be entered by the owner in person or by another attendee on his/her behalf.
- The exhibitor or proxy completes a single sheet entry form for each plant entered for judging.
- As an alternative option when it is not possible to bring the blooming plant, the entire flowering inflorescence can be mailed to the contact listed for the judging center.
- If mailing an entry for judging, please contact the center chair first to confirm the mailing address.

AOS plant judging takes place the 3rd Saturday each month. Judging is always open to the public and anyone is invited to bring plants for the AOS judges to look at them. AOS awards given are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Sessions begin at 11 AM Eastern Time with any center business and then an educational talk by judges or other featured speakers. AOS judging begins no later than 1 PM Eastern Time. The Great Lakes Judging Center is responsible for AOS judging in the region spanning Michigan, Northern Indiana, and Northern Ohio. Judging sessions are held at Washtenaw Community College located at 4800 E. Huron River Dr. Ann Arbor, Michigan 48105. Activities take place in the Morris Lawrence building. Parking is ample and free. Dress is casual and all are welcome to bring lunch or snacks for themselves as no food is provided.
