
#### A Letter from the President

## Society News

## A Note from Jill:

I know our show in January seems so far away, but some of the behind-the-scenes work is already starting. For AOS judges in the mid-west, the show season ended in April and starts up again in August. We also meet monthly for education and AOS judging year-round.

At most shows, plants are arranged in displays by a single owner (like a vendor) or a group of owners (like an Orchid Society) and entered in classes based on the size and type of owner. Each individual plant is then entered into a class based on what the plant is. Some genera are kept together like all Zygopetalum and intergenerics are class 106) and other genera are divided based on size and color (like Phalaenopsis are classes 48-62). Societies in our area use the Mid-America Orchid Congress (MAOC) Show Schedule, other areas may use a different class schedule. During ribbon judging, teams judge each class for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Then the 1<sup>st</sup> place winners are in competition with each other in Trophy groups (Best Cattleya Alliance for example). All of the plant trophy winners are then in competition with each other for the "Best of Show" Trophy.

A challenging part of ribbon judging is making sure that all the registered plants get reviewed and then the right ribbon gets on the right plant. The processes vary by show, but the Phalaenopsis NOIDs are a particular challenge. It does make judges cry when they get the list of plants in a class and there are 15 plants called "Phalaenopsis NOID – pink" in a single class.

A NOID is a plant of unknown parentage. It can be of any genera, but most commonly seen in Phalaenopsis purchased at "big box" stores (think Lowes, Trader Joes, etc). They have a beautiful flower that you cannot resist, but the tag in the pot just says Phalaenopsis (and might tell you how many ice cubes to water it with – you need to ignore that part). This can also be applied to plants that have lost their tags.

To make sure your plants is seen during judging and gets the ribbon it was awarded, I am asking you to "Name the NOIDs". I am not asking you to do a ton of research and find a registered hybrid that looks like your plant to call it something that it may not be. I am asking you to give your NOID a "NOID name" so that it is unique. Please keep the NOID at the start of the name – this will avoid confusion when plants are being pulled for AOS judging.

#### JUDING CENTER DETAILS

The AOS's judging system comprises 27 judging centers. The centers provide opportunities for the public to have plants judged on specified monthly dates. Center activities are open to visitors who wish to see the judging process in operation or bring in plants to be evaluated. Orchid plants can be submitted for judging using the following guidelines:

- All blooming orchid plants or cut flowers submitted at a monthly judging session are candidates for awards.
- Candidates should be entered in the most presentable condition possible.
- Candidates may be entered by the owner in person or by another attendee on his/her behalf.
- The exhibitor or proxy completes a single sheet entry form for each plant entered for judging.
- As an alternative option when it is not possible to bring the blooming plant, the entire flowering inflorescence can be mailed to the contact listed for the judging center.
- If mailing an entry for judging, please contact the center chair first to confirm the mailing address.

AOS plant judging takes place the 3rd Saturday each month. Judging is always open to

the public and anyone is invited to bring plants for the AOS judges to look at them.

Sessions begin at 11 AM Eastern Time with any center business and then an educational

talk by judges or other featured speakers. AOS judging begins no later than  $1\ \mathrm{PM}$ 

Eastern Time. The Great Lakes Judging Center is responsible for AOS judging in the

region spanning Michigan, Northern Indiana, and Northern Ohio. Judging sessions are held at Washtenaw Community College which is located at 4800 E.

Huron River Dr. Ann Arbor, Michigan 48105. Activities take place in the Morris

Lawrence building, Room 160 but occasionally it is moved to another room in the same

building. Parking is ample and free. Dress is casual and all are welcome to bring lunch

or snacks for themselves as no food is provided. Any awards given are subject to AOS

Award fees which are presently \$40 for AOS members and \$60 for non-members.
