



Platystele

Schltr. 1910

Pronunciation:

<u>plat-e-STEE-le</u> (click on the name to hear it spoken)

Tribe: Epidendreae

Subtribe: Pleurothallidinae

The genus was first described by Schlechter in 1910. The name derives from *platys* = broad and *stele* = column in reference to the broad, flat column characteristic of the genus. *Platystele* species have mostly tufted, short-stemmed leaves and are found in the moist, neotropical forests most commonly at moderately high altitudes 1,500 m (4,900 feet) to 2,500 m (8,200 feet) where other genera of the Pleurothallidinae are also abundant.

Number of species:

The World Checklist of Monocotyledons recognizes 116 species. (2/2020)

Distribution:

Widespread from Mexico to Bolivia but infrequent in Brazil. The greatest concentration of species occurs in the Andes of Colombia and Ecuador.

--- CULTURE---

	Most species of <i>Platystele</i> can be cultivated in intermediate to cool conditions. They will tolerate some warmer temperatures only it plenty of humidity and air
	movement is present, but not for long periods of time.
	Most <i>Platystele</i> species prefer shady to partial shade conditions as the small

	year around when happy, there is no real season for bloom booster fertilizer.

Potting:	Grow <i>Platystele</i> in small pots in a fine seedling grade mixture or on slabs with some moisture retaining material at the roots. Provide medium light levels, intermediate to cool-intermediate temperatures, and steady watering throughout the year.
