


## Society News

# Warmingia

Reichenbach f. 1881

## Pronunciation:

**war-MING-ee-ah** (click on the name to hear it spoken)

Tribe: Cymbidieae

Subtribe: Oncidiinae

This small genus was first described in 1881 and was named to honor Prof. Eugenia Warming who discovered the type species, *Warmingia eugenii* in Minas Gerais State, Brazil. The genus is allied to *Macradenia* and *Notylia*. *Warmingia* species are epiphytic in nature and are found in areas of wet forests from sea level to 1,000 meters. *W. eugenii*, most often found in cultivation, is a charming plant with a pendent inflorescence of 'feathery goose down-like' white flowers.

## Number of species:

The World Monocot Checklist currently recognizes 4 species. (1/2020)

### --- CULTURE ---

<b>Temperature:</b>	Intermediate
<b>Light:</b>	Moderate shade
<b>Water-Humidity:</b>	Good humidity; water throughout the year, avoiding water settling between the tufted pseudobulbs.

<b>Fertilizer:</b>	A balanced, diluted solution, every other week; avoid build up of fertilizer salts by drenching with plain water once a month.
<b>Potting:</b>	Best grown on treefern plaques because of pendent floral habit; shallow pans can also be used.
