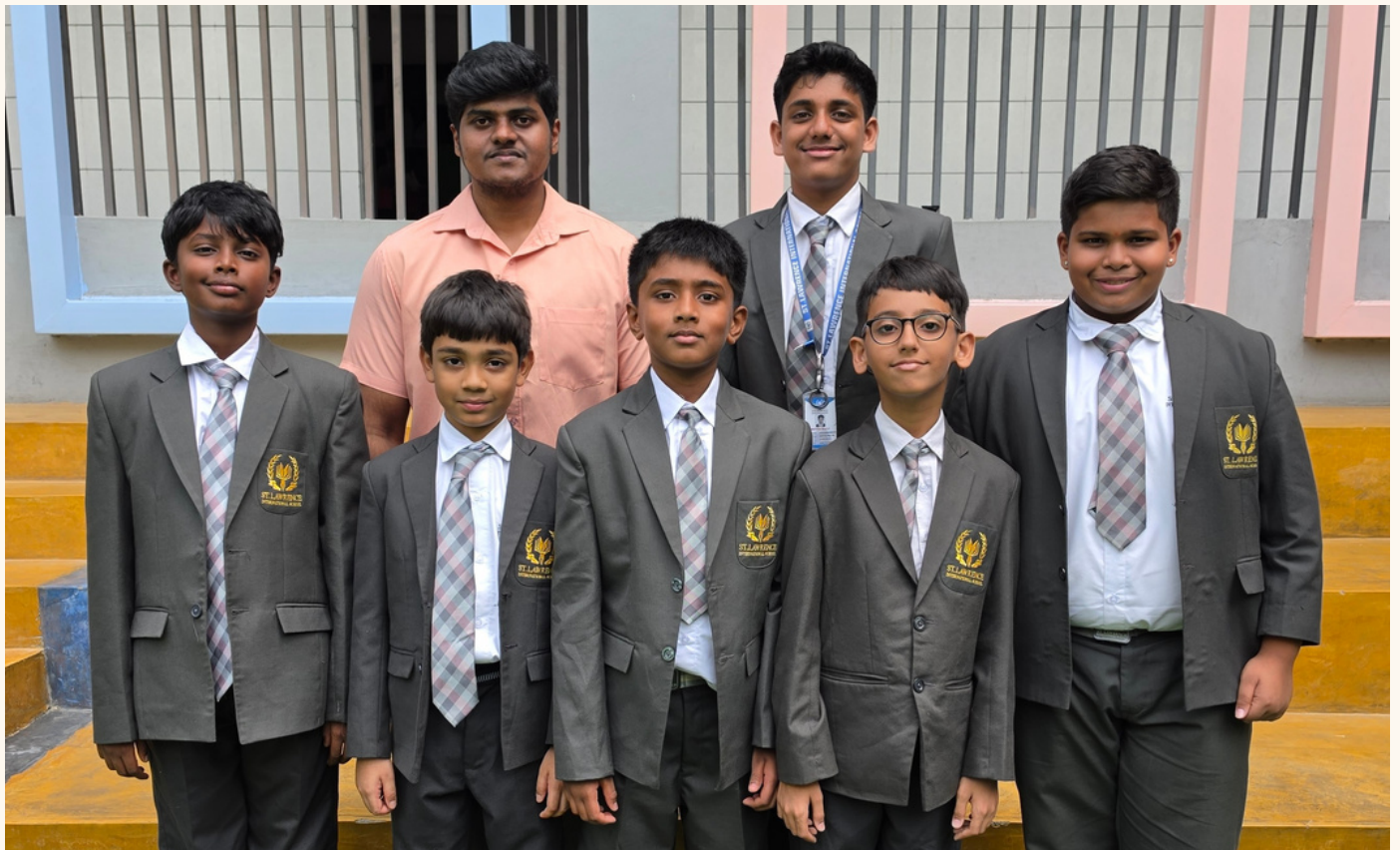
SLIS Shines at Robotex India National Championship 2026
