The Safford City – Graham County Library's Early

Literacy Concert Series promotes literacy for young learners through music and live performance. The library's Early Literacy



Coordinator first imagined the concert series when she stumbled upon the music of Latin Grammy winner Mister G while researching songs for the library's bilingual StoryTime. With overwhelming support from local partners, the Safford City -Graham County Library launched its first concert in 2022. The concert spanned across two days, included teacher workshops, provided a free book for families and teachers to take back to their classrooms, and attracted 2,000 people. The program encourages the daily practice of singing, talking, reading, writing, and playing in combination with school readiness skills of phonological awareness, print awareness, background knowledge, letter knowledge, and vocabulary. The initiative is loved by the community and continues to expand each year.

Yuyi Morales Exhibit

The library is thrilled to be hosting a traveling exhibit, Sonadora, from the National Center for

Morales is a six-time recipient of the prestigious Pura Belpre award and the first Latina to earn a Caldecott honor for her book Viva Frida. This exhibit, featuring sixty-one pieces of Morales' original art from sixteen of her books, is currently on display in the main area of the library and in the program room until December 5th. GED Preparation Classes and Testing

The library is happy to announce that in-person GED Preparation Classes are available for Graham



and Greenlee Counties thanks to a grant from the United Way! Whether you are brushing up on your skills to prepare for the test or taking

the first steps toward your future, this program is designed for you to succeed! Currently, hours are Tuesday and Wednesday from 10 am – 6 pm. If you would like more information, please email the Adult Education Instructor, Kristi Apodaca, at <u>kapodaca@saffordaz.gov</u>. Please expect a response within a week.

Additionally, the library is an official GED testing site, with in-person testing available Mondays and Wednesdays from 3-7 pm. Act One Culture Passes

The library Culture Pass program includes 19 cultural institutions around Arizona. Passes are available for checkout to adults with a library card in good standing, with one pass per household.



Passes are usable for one week after checkout on a first-comefirst-served basis. A new institution,

Lowell Observatory in Flagstaff, will have passes available beginning November 1st.

Makerspace Open Hours are Tuesdays and

Thursdays 5 – 7 pm. The Makerspace includes 3D printing, a Cricut machine, recording equipment and a Glowforge. Training is required before being able to use the Makerspace equipment.



Additionally, the **second Saturday of each month is a tabletop/game day from 12-6 pm**. The public can bring their own games to play or play games the library provides. Those under age 16 must be accompanied by a parent.

StoryTime and Outreach

Preschool StoryTime program for the academic year is in the Early Literacy Room on Thursdays at 10 am. The Bilingual StoryTime program is the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 10 am in the Early Literacy Room. Spanish fluency is not

required to attend. StoryTime programs only were held in the library program



room during the summer due to higher attendance.

Staff has begun **outreach** to local area preschools in Graham and Greenlee Counties. Staff visit Palomita,

Sierra Bonita, Ruth Powell, First United Methodist Church, Brighter Day and Duncan Preschools each month. There is a StoryTime with fingerplays each month, with the book topic chosen based on themes covered in each classroom.

Past Programs/Events

Library Card Signup Month

The library celebrated National Library Card Signup Month by premiering a new library card with a **photo of the Gila Box by local photographer, Patricia Abeyta**. The library also asked several local leaders to come and receive their new library



card, or to get their first library card, which were then featured on the library's social media pages. The library would like to thank the Friends of the Library as they provided a certificate for a free scoop of ice cream at Garrett's Sweet Shop for the first 50 new card holders.



Bingo for Books!



The library hosted the second annual Bingo for Books program on Thursday, August 22nd. Those who got Bingo

could pick a book and/or reading buddy as their prize. The library also advertised upcoming fall programs throughout the event, with handouts for more information to those interested. Over the event, 64 participated and added a over 100 books to their home libraries!

Library Fall Programming

The library began fall programming for grades K-3, 4-6, and teen audiences in September. Dependent on the group, participants could learn about pulleys, bees, Greek Art or cooking. Programs are Tuesdays (grades K-3), Wednesdays (4-6), and Thursdays (teen) at 4pm until the end of November. For the month of September, 261 attended elementary age or teen programming.



After a December hiatus, elementary and teen programs will resume on the same days and times from January to the end of April.

Cooking Class

The library hosted Sourdough preparation classes for the Cooperative Extension at the Library Annex

on September 4th. The program provided instruction on how to prepare, maintain and use a Sourdough starter, a friendship bread starter and a fruit



starter. The 70 attendees also were able to take a sourdough starter sample home, to continue to grow it.

In October classes on the 2nd focused on chili with Curry Chili Co. explaining the different types of chili and how they grow it. November's program will provide instruction on preparing green chili tamales.

Teen Advisory Group



The library Teen Advisory Group has been meeting since August. The goal of the group is to help the library in developing programs and services for

teens in the community. Currently, the group meets once to twice a month to plan the next month's program. In October, the group hosted a Fright Night, where they created and shared scary stories. The group will host teen programs in November and December.
