

Freshwater Start Up Check List

You will need:

- Tank Kit (tank, filter, light, heater, net, thermometer)
- Dechlorinator
- Bacteria Starter
- Decorations, gravel, plants (real or plastic), bubble wand
- Fish Food
- Test strips

After tank set up, add a small number of fish.

Add bacteria and new fish at the same time.

3 options:

- 1. If starting with dechlorinated water without added bacteria, feed the fish. Nitrogen cycle takes for 6-8 weeks to complete. Do periodic water tests during this time period to see when more fish can be added safely.
- 2. If adding fish and bacteria at same time, test water after 1-2 weeks to see when it's safe to add more fish.
- 3. If cycled water (water from an established tank) is used, fish can be added immediately. Still need to add only a couple of fish at a time.

Test the water. Once ammonia and nitrite levels are zero, you can gradually add more fish. Basic Guideline: Add 1 inch fish per gallon water.

Once you have nitrate in your system, it's time to do weekly 10-20% water change depending on bio-load.
