Scholarship Purpose: To financially assist those Christian students who have been active at ENUMC and who are furthering their education at post-secondary schools.

Eligibility Criteria: Applicant must be a senior in high school or currently attending a college/university/technical/trade school. All applicants (traditional and non-traditional) must be active participants and/or members of ENUMC. **Applications must be typed, completed within the allotted space requirements, and filled in properly in order to be considered.**

Scholarship Award: Awards will be presented to students in the spring. In August, checks will be made payable to the school the applicant is or will be attending. Please note that a completed application does not guarantee an applicant will receive a scholarship.

Scholarship Committee: The committee shall be comprised of people who do not have a family member applying for a scholarship. Applications will be ranked and “blindly” scored based on a 100-point system as outlined on the following pages.
