Notes from the Music Department


ENUMC has been so blessed to have so many talented musicians willing to share their gifts with us during our weekly worship service.

Bible Study Updates

JOY BIBLE STUDY:

Beginning June 3, Joy Bible group will be studying Dennis Prager's The Rational Bible—book of Exodus. Prager is a Jew and hosts a radio talk show. He has established the non-profit Prager University online and traveled all over the world giving lectures about Judeo-Christian beliefs.

In his commentaries, he uses original Hebrew Scriptures in his interpretations and tackles such subjects and view points as: Is it ok to be angry with God?; How many Israelites really left Egypt?; Do people prefer liberty or to be taken care of?; The worst sin is committing evil in God's name; and The ninth commandment: lies cause the greatest evils.

Prager's overriding theme is the goodness of God and that God demands we be good—the only belief that will enable us to make a good world. Furthermore, the Torah (first 5 books of the Bible) is the greatest source of goodness and wisdom to ever be written and imparted; but in this modern age people have increasingly replaced Bible-based homes and schools with homes and schools that are devoid of any Biblical-based codes for living. As a result, we are less wise and morally confused and are led to support evil ideologies and regimes.

Throughout his book, Prager uses reason to support his beliefs, yet is not hesitant to say he doesn't have an answer to some questions.

SEEKERS BIBLE STUDY:

The book of Hebrews gives ample encouragement to believers, but there are five solemn warnings we must heed. There is the danger of neglect (Hebrews 2:1-4), the danger of unbelief (Hebrews 3:7-4:13), the danger of spiritual immaturity (Hebrews 5:11-6:20), the danger of failing to endure (Hebrews 10:26-39), and the inherent danger of refusing God (Hebrews 12:25-29). The book of Hebrews manifests and draws our attention to our Lord Jesus Christ—the Author and Finisher of our great salvation (Hebrews 12:2). Join us Sunday mornings for this line by line study.

Connecting Christ to People Through Love

A few weeks ago, a gentleman (I will hereinafter refer to as John) came into the office carrying a small bouquet of hand-picked flowers. He'd come to the office the day before in search of a razor. Zuri, the office assistant, searched but did not find one; he came back with the bouquet to thank her for her efforts.

In trying to convince me to take the bouquet for myself, he launched into a litany of flattery and wanted to know where I was from. It felt like a scene from the story Rumpelstiltskin. "Are you from Haiti?" "No." "Guatemala?" "No." "Jamaica?" "No." "So where are you from then?" "I belong to the kingdom of heaven," I said. He laughed a deep raspy laugh. "What is your name?" Without hesitation, I replied, "Child of God!"

"Okay, Child of God, you see that picture on the wall, the one depicting the Road to Emmaus, I have been there." He pointed to a picture hanging on the wall in the hallway of the office. It amazed me that something about the picture had caught not just his natural attention, but more importantly, I believe it caught his spiritual attention.

He shared his story of how he got caught up in a life of booze and drugs and spoke with regret about not fighting harder for the things of the spirit. He said he has moments when he tries to speak the truth about Jesus to his friends and they dismiss him as just being "high." While he was telling his story, he would pause and refer to me by the name I gave him, i.e., *Child of God*.

I have been seriously referring to myself as *Child of God* for almost two decades now (there is a story behind it), and when I do, I do not do so out of arrogance or jest, I do it because it is the one connection I have made that serves me well.

I am connected to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. John 8:36 says, "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." I rest assured every day in that knowledge and in that liberty.

One of the aspects I have most enjoyed on this job, is the blessing of meeting some genuinely beautiful (in spirit) people and having the good pleasure to listen to their stories. From the volunteers who serve, to members who come in and out of the office, and then, there's been a few like John who walked through the front door. I think of these moments as "Ministry" moments. It is not a part of my job description, but working for an organization built around people, I think it is one of those unspecified duties that we all should engage in.

ENUMC's mission, *Connecting Christ to People in Love*, has to be more than words on paper—it needs to be lived out on a regular basis every time we, for lack of a better word, connect with each other.

Who are the people Christ connected to, and how did he connect with them? If we go through the New Testament, we will read one account after another of Jesus communing, fellowshipping, and taking the time to "shoot the breeze" (if you will) with the most unlikely of people. And in doing so, he was able to draw out the good that would otherwise remain dormant in them.

I am sure I did not have the effect Jesus would have had if John was to have encountered Him directly. However, as an ambassador of Christ, I did my best to let John know that I did not have a monopoly on the name or idea that I was a Child of God. I also reassured him that it was never too late to invite Jesus into his life as Jesus is standing, waiting with open arms to accept anyone who boldly confesses Him as their personal Lord and Savior.

Please join me in praying for John and all those like him who are in an abyss of one addiction or another. Did you know that there are addictions beyond drugs and alcohol? Out of a deep need to connect with *SOMETHING*, more and more people are getting hooked on all sorts of thrills to get them through the hours of the day when they are awake.

But how do we first connect to these people (who are desperately seeking *SOMETHING*)—how do we reach them? And please don't think they only reside across the street in rehab. No, they are in every class of accommodation, in every zip code, and from all ethnicities.

I was not quite sure how to close this article, I considered many angles but wanted to be sure I left the reader with the right call to action and so I prayed. Here is the response, (that only the Holy Spirit could have delivered) from 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 (NIV):

Paul's Use of His Freedom

¹⁹ Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible. ²⁰ To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. ²¹ To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. ²² To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. ²³ I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.




Scholarship Committee News

Bargain Nook News


I am so happy we were able to get all our bargain nook volunteers together before Summer started. Many will be taking vacations, and fortunately, only one person left to go back north for the summer.
