

A Counter Culture People

Some people say, "I own this, and I own that," or "I own this body, and no one has the right to tell me what to do with it." People who think this way would benefit from standing in front of a mirror, exposing their midsection, noting their belly button, and asking, "Why is that there?" The answer is: "There was a day when one male sperm beat millions of others in a race for one female egg, and the end result produced me." The One who devised the process still owns the end result – each one of us!

During this New Year, let us remember the staggering truth the Bible reveals: he had/has one of those marks on His midsection. Moreover, He never claimed to own anything and saw life as something on loan, to be given away to glorify His Father by serving others. When He washed His disciples' feet, He demonstrated vividly the upside-down Kingdom He came to establish. And His Father said "Yes!" to that action in a powerful way!

The more I reflect on the post-modern happenings around us, the more I sense that **several** symbols are missing from our place of worship. Yes, we all love the cross – the standard fixture in most churches. But should we not also have a basin and a towel (John 13) on our altar or table, as a reminder of the counterculture Jesus came to establish? Then we might better understand that the cross is not only the symbol of the world's rejection of God's counter-culture, but also the throne of the King of the eternal kingdom. The irony is that when people did their worst to Jesus, they provided Him the opportunity to do his best for them – to forgive them and capture their hearts.

In addition to the basin, towel, and cross, we need a symbol of the empty tomb. It would remind us that though the powers-that-be said "No!" to God's kind of Messiah and Kingdom, the Father said "Yes!" He asks each us, "And just what are you going to do with Him now?" And lastly, we need a symbol of God's inbreaking future. A symbol of "Christ's-being-on-the-way" would remind us that God is in control of history, and that the "not-yet" will unfold according to His will.

We at ENUMC have a peculiar calling in that we exist to help people grapple with the context and message of the "Coming One." We are here to worship, as a corporate body, the "Coming King" and launch out into the world to proclaim and live out the victory of the King as a counter-culture people. We are here to anticipate the coming of Christ and take the message of hope and salvation to all persons.

This first event will serve the Learning Center Families. We hope that we might expand in the future to include New Horizons families. Palm Lake Mobile Home Park families and eventually other groups in our community. Please pray for this new project and consider helping financially or with the planning and distribution of the meals.














Sunday, January 17, 2021

When you support Human Relations Day, your gift builds community leadership and resources. In Chicago, churches are in partnership to engage in community-based alternatives to juvenile incarceration. In the Philippines, organizations strengthen family resiliency to address substance abuse, particularly with those who are living in the Manila North

Cemetery. In West Congo, United Methodist Churches are working with ecumenical partners to provide pastoral support and advocacy for children and youth who are in prison.

Buena Vista United Methodist Church's slogan is "Building beloved community."

Among the programs of the Alameda, California, church is a partnership with the Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity (IM4HI) to engage in joint immigration advocacy. Members have co-sponsored "Know Your Rights" trainings, lobbied for human rights legislation and attended monthly protest vigils on behalf of incarcerated immigrants. Working with IM4HI and its East Bay affiliate enables the church to network and advocate with other congregations.

The church's immigration committee in 2016 began its accompaniment ministry and provided temporary housing to the Alva-Garcia family from Guatemala. That allowed the family to establish residency in Alameda and to welcome other family members entering the country seeking asylum.

Lynette Lee, chair of the Buena Vista Community Institute, and Alton Chinn, the immigration committee's new chair, want to increase participation and indigenous leadership in the ministry and do more to protect and support immigrants.

According to Chinn, "COVID-19 doesn't change our commitment to this ministry."


