Our ENUMC Concert Series kicked off another wonderful season! The first concert was the "Young Artists Recital." Several outstanding and accomplished young musicians performed along with their teachers. Thanks to all of our donors who make this concert series possible. Our next concert is the Dan Miller/Randy Sandke Quintet on November 10, 2019, at 3:00 pm. Join trumpeters Dan Miller and Randy Sandke as they celebrate the genius and music of George Gershwin. The music that Gershwin composed for the Broadway stage and the Hollywood screen became an integral part of the Great American Songbook and was loved by musicians, singers, and audiences alike. The program will include such favorites as Embraceable You, Oh Lady Be Good, I Got Rhythm, Summertime, S'Wonderful, Our Love Is Here To Stay, Love Walked In, Strike Up The Band, Soon, The Man I Love, But Not For Me, and They Can't Take That Away from Me.

Dan Miller built his reputation touring and recording with Harry Connick Jr., Wynton Marsalis, Maynard Ferguson, Woody Herman, and Tom Jones. Randy Sandke is one of the world's greatest jazz trumpeters and has recorded with many of the legends of this music including Benny Goodman, Mel Torme, Rosemary Clooney, Michael Brecker, and Dick Hyman. For this concert, they bring together a tremendous group of musicians for an afternoon of hard-swinging, acoustic jazz music including pianist Roy Gerson, bassist Don Mopsick, and the great master drummer, Marty Morell (member of the Bill Evans Trio for six years 1968 -1974).

Please join us for our 2019 Christmas Concert and Cantata - "Joy Has Dawned" by Lloyd Larson on Sunday, December 1st at 3:00 pm. Choirs from six churches are coming together to present special Christmas music and cantata with a 17-piece orchestra. 
