# From the Ground Up 2019 - Rebuilding & Revitalization



The former building structures had been completely torn down by a previous owner before the VCP gained ownership. In its place, the VCP rebuilt a beautiful open-air pavilion, thanks to a \$75,000 grant from a private foundation, and a 2,250 building with a gathering room, bathrooms, office, and warming kitchen--The Summers Clubhouse.

# Before & After - Small Pool - "Hale Pool"



The Hale Family gave a gift of \$25,000 that helped with the restoration of our smaller pool. This is the pool where the Hales two young children first learned to swim in the early 2000s, before the complex's demise.

# Enthusiasm & Community Support



Supporters came together to celebrate the groundbreaking ceremony. Every step of the construction and rebuilding process was led by volunteers--neighbors and friends who saw a need and offered to help in whatever capacity they were able.

Thousands of volunteer hours were logged in 2019 as the land was cleared, through the planning stages, and throughout construction.

Currently, 375 households support the VCP as "Friends of the Village"--member households who gave an initial donation to our capital campaign and pledge their ongoing financial support.

New classes are being added on a continuing basis and are open to the community.
