ABOUT THE PROGRAM

LIWP's Farmworker Housing Energy Efficiency and Solar PV Program component installs free energy efficiency measures at eligible homes to save energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. All services are provided at no cost to eligible low-income farmworker households.

This program:

- Increases energy efficiency of homes owned or rented by farmworker families
- Reduces energy bills
- Can fund solar photovoltaic (PV) panels
- Includes some health and safety improvements and repairs to homes

Serving the Community

This program serves farmworker households in **Imperial, Fresno, Kern, Madera, Merced, Monterey, Riverside, San Joaquin, Santa Barbara, Stanislaus, Tulare,** and **Ventura** counties.

At least **one** household member must be an **agricultural employee** and the household must meet the program's **income guidelines** to qualify.

If the household qualifies, one of our trusted contractor partners will evaluate the home for the **best available upgrades**.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

CSD selected La Cooperativa Campesina de California as the administrator for this program. A team of partner organizations is coordinating outreach, enrollment, and services. The team includes MAROMA Energy Services and Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Agencies.

The team is working with local governments, community organizations, farms and agricultural employers to refer farmworkers to the program.

This program needs community partners to successfully deliver services to some of California's most vulnerable households.

PREVIOUS PROJECTS

Since 2015, LIWP has installed free solar PV and energy efficiency measures in more than 20,000 households.
