Acadia	O	A - Its western slopes are the wettest place in the 48 contiguous states
Arches	Q	B - Remarkable ancestral Puebloan cliff dwellings
Big Bend	G	C - Appalachian Trail passes thru this park.
Biscayne	F	D - Northernmost National Park, 8.7 million acres. Larger than 9 smallest states.
Crater Lake	J	E - Looks like a scene from Dr. Seuss
Death Valley	U	F - The Maritime Heritage Trail - only underwater archaeological trail in Park system.
Devils Tower	P	G - The Rio Grande River makes a U-turn here.
Everglades	K	H - At 275 sq miles, it's the largest gypsum dunefield in the world.
Gates of the Arctic	D	I - It's vegetation has air roots to absorb water. "The President" is said to be 2,200 years old.
Glacier	S	J - Its leading feature is 1,943 ft. deep.
Grand Canyon	V	K - Marshy track of land, covered in tall grass. Only ecosystem of its kind in the world.
Hawai'i Volcanoes	N	L - 400 miles of mapped trails
Isle Royal	X	M - El Capitan
Joshua Tree	E	N - Ever changing coastline
Mammoth Cave	L	O - Located on Mount Desert Island
Mesa Verde	B	P - Close encounters with one of the finest crack climbing areas in North America.
National Mall & Monuments Park	R	Q - Sandstone – these beat McDonalds'
Olympic	A	R - Pink "snow" falls from pink trees in Spring
Petrified Forest	T	S - Crown of the Continent–waters flow to Gulf of Mexico, Pacific Ocean, and Hudson Bay
Sequoia	I	T - These trees are solid (stoned?)!
Shenandoah	C	U - Surrounded by 9 mountain ranges, formed from a 600' deep lake
White Sands	K	V - 277 miles long, up to 18 miles wide and a mile deep.
Yellowstone	W	W - Oldest National Park, established in 1872 (faithfully served for over 140 years).
Yosemite	M	X - Large island with 450 smaller islands, known for its copper.
