- WHEREAS, April is designated as Financial Literacy Month throughout the United States. The recognition was established to highlight the importance of financial literacy and teach Americans how to establish and maintain healthy financial habits; and
- WHEREAS, the unique value added to the Syracuse and Onondaga County community through the 2021 Financial Empowerment Summit is the intentional cultivation of an inclusive environment. The conference will create a platform where a cross-section of diverse socioeconomic and demographic topics and experts will come together to offer insight to combat poverty and build wealth; and
- WHEREAS, virtual attendees will learn how to budget, save, increase their net worth, and improve their credit scores through customized track sessions; and
