<u>September 20, 2019, Friday, 7 PM</u>: Early Dutch Homes in the Mohawk and Hudson Valleys. Our speaker will be Marilyn Sassi, an adjunct instructor at both Schenectady County Community College and Hudson Valley Community College. Her program will focus on examples of Dutch architecture from the 17<sup>th</sup> and early 18<sup>th</sup> centuries including a few of the rural dwellings that are still intact. October 18, 2019, Friday, 7 PM: Preserving Family Papers. Our speaker will be Jonathan Palmer, Archivist, at the Vedder Research Library of the Greene County Historical Society in Coxsackie. He will discuss what types of personal documents to save for future generations, how to organize them and what resources are available to assist in preserving them. November 15, 2019, Friday, 7 PM: Eighty Year Old Widow. Ron Gabriele, a former associate professor at Columbia-Greene Community College will be speaking on Helen Dortch Longstreet who at the start of World War II took on the job of riveting B-29 bombers. She was one of the best riveters at the factory and an original "Rosie the Riveter". Mr. Gabriele will also present other interesting information about the B-29 bombers. Castleton Fire House.

<u>February 21, 2020, Friday, 7 PM:</u> Russell Sage, the Money King. Our speaker will be Michael P. Barrett, Executive Director of the Hudson Mohawk Industrial Gateway and Burden Iron Works Museum in Troy. Mr. Barrett will discuss the story of Russell Sage, a "Robber Baron" of the Gilded Age and how, after Sage's death in 1906, his wife's reaction to his passing became one of the greatest stories of philanthropic retaliation in American history.
