Approve Club Meeting Minutes for June 27, 2024

Maggie made motion, Lorraine seconded, to approve the minutes for the June 27, 2024, meeting. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Treasurer Update-Marlys

The Adopt a Grandparent Program had \$4,268 in the checkbook. There was an outstanding donation of \$200 to Harmony in the Park. New posters were printed, and volunteers are needed to post them around the community. There were 2,562 buttons sold for the Karl Oskar Days Raffle, and the Club made \$513. Miranda explained the City of Lindstrom was not able to conduct the raffle, and it needed to be passed on to a non-profit organization. The GNC will need to decide if they want to do it again next year. The Triathlon donated \$1,000 for the Club's participation in monitoring the water course. The GNC checkbook was at approximately \$7,300. There was an outstanding expenditure of \$500 for the Chisago Lakes School District Scholarship.

Grant Opportunity

Last year, the CLGNC received a \$6,000 Big Idea Grant from the Chisago Lakes Area Community Foundation for the Adopt a Grandparent Program. Another program was currently accepting applications. Grants can be applied for to fund any cause that has a good community impact. There is a \$3,000 grant maximum, and the deadline is September 4, 2024. Marlys asked for members to come up with ideas.

Coffee Pot Sales Committee Update - Pattie A.

There were 74 coffee pots sold at Karl Oskar Days, and approximately 49 still available for purchase. It was decided 50 more would be needed for Ki Chi Saga Days, and Miranda will have them available for pickup at City Hall the following day. She said the goal was \$15,000 to implement the steam, and they were currently at around \$400 after expenses.

Ki Chi Saga Booth Sales

Sales will be at the park during Ki Chi Saga Days, August 17-18. Craig and Patti will be at the booth in the morning until 1 p.m. on Saturday. Lori, Shelley, and Marlys will do the 1-5 p.m. shift, and Jeri Rochelle will be there on Sunday.

Fall Harvest Fest

There was mention of the Fall Harvest Festival scheduled for September 21. The organizers were still seeking permission from the City and businesses. Miranda will keep the group posted.

Steam Initiative - QR Code for donations - Miranda O.

Lindstrom Mayor Judy Chartrand had applied for a \$3,000 grant for the coffee pot steam initiative. A requirement of the grant was to have the project completed in one year. The City is unable to utilize Venmo and PayPal to accept electronic payments for donations. Judy was looking for a non-profit to help facilitate, possibly through a QR code that would make it easy for people to donate. This item will go before the Board for discussion due to cost and time needed for bookkeeping purposes. It was mentioned that the Club should receive something in return. Patti said the Club had collected \$173 in donations at the park, and she brought up the idea of the GNC applying for the grant also.

Membership - Christa L.

There were currently 90 members. Rochelle, Leslie, and Tom joined the Membership Committee. Christa had passed out white slips for members to share their random acts of kindness.

Food Drop at Family Pathways Friday, August 9

Marlys was arranging a food drop and \$476 in cash at Family Pathways. She was waiting for them to get back to her on the time and was looking for people who may be available. She will let others know.

Ki Chi Saga Days Parade on August 18

Set up will take place at the Dunne house at 11:30 a.m. Line up is at 1 p.m. and the parade is at 2 p.m. There was discussion on whether to get more bags or hand out candy, and the consensus was to get candy. This could be purchased at Costco.

Shafer Days Robbery Reenactment on Saturday, September 14 at noon

Group met last Friday with the Olmschenks who had been doing the robbery reenactment for years and want the CLGNC to take it over. Marlys will send out the materials to everyone. Freddie will be the bank robber, and Rusty the narrator. Lori, Miranda, Craig, and Shelley will help organize. Tom offered to help Shelley with the car show signup.

Path to Home Volunteers on September 1st -7th and December 1st -7th

Trinity Church houses the homeless for a week in September and December. Lori will lead the rock painting activity with the kids. Shelley has volunteered to help, and more volunteers are welcome.

Zion Community Dinner October 21

A signup sheet will be sent out for volunteers. The GNC served 272 dinners last time. It begins at 3:30 p.m., and servers are asked to bring a pan of desserts.

Triathlon Water Course Recap

The Club received a \$1,000 donation for helping with the water course. There were 11 pontons and nine kayakers, and some members also supervised the running course. Marlys said Du Tri was please and wants to work with the Club again next year, provided they get the permit.

National Night Out Recap

GNC members Rochelle, Christa, and Freddie were a few of the GNC members that attended National Night Out at Parmly. Marlys shared a "thank you" note the Club received.

Threshing Show
