- Check for drafts around doors and windows.



4. Declutter closets and cabinets

In addition to readying for potential sellers, if you do move later in the year, it's one less chore you'll have to worry about while packing. Not only is this a great way to start the year fresh, but it's a must for home selling. - Carpeting and flooring: Most renovations happening during the spring and summer months, which
