In the magi, we see knowledge affirmed by faith.

Balthazar encountered a middle-aged teacher and they spoke passionately of leadership and responsibility. When Casper entered, he met a young prophet, and they talked of reform and promise. After that, the three of them entered together with their gifts. There, they met an infant with his mother. Later, they began to understand. Jesus, the Savior, speaks to each of us at every stage of life. The elderly hear the call to integrity and wisdom. The middle-aged hear the call to generosity and responsibility. The young hear the call to authenticity and intimacy.

Today, the call of the Savior is extended to each of us.
