



Lent is only a week and a half away. In order to prepare for Ash Wednesday, this week I am sharing with you a letter from the archdiocese which came from Rome on how we are to distribute ashes this year while the pandemic is still present among us.

Due to continued precautions of the pandemic, please do not individually distribute ashes to the forehead with your thumb because of the increased risk of contagion. Acknowledging that you are not obliged to administer ashes, but for pastoral reasons you may, we have the following two options.

 The Congregation of Divine Worship provided a note of guidance for the distribution of ashes during the time of pandemic. The suggestion is to bless the ashes, say the prayer once "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return," and then sprinkle the blessed ashes on the head of each person with out saying anything. This is an ancient method of the distribution of ashes. All COVID-19 precautions remain in place.

Since many are unfamiliar with this custom, it is important to explain to all gathered that this method will be used.

2. However, at the discretion of the Pastor, and with attention all COVID-19 precautions, it is permissible to use a Q-tip or cotton ball to impose ashes on the forehead of each person with the sign of the Cross. Discard the applicator after each use and burn the used Tuesday and Friday

applicator after each use and burn the used applicators. It is important to explain this option to all gathered.

Please do not send blessed ashes home, nor encourage the imposition of ashes on oneself.

Ash Wednesday is February 17th. Mass times are 8:30 am and 7:00 pm in the Church. There will also be an Ash Service at 12:00 pm in the Church. Tuesday and Friday 8:30 am in Church Saturday 4:30 pm in Church Sunday 9:00 am and 11:00 am in Church

Confessions will be heard every Saturday at 3:30 pm

Acts of Spiritual Communion

11 has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

RELIGIOUS FORMATION


