This week there are two more directions from the archdiocese. They are as follows:

In recognition of the essential and central nature of the Eucharist Sacrifice in our lives as Catholics, and in acknowledgement of my duty as shepherd to care for the souls of everyone within our diocese, it is important that I lead more of us back to Mass, when and where possible. That is why the general dispensation from the Sunday obligation will be extended only for one month, until March 13. It is time for us to welcome back more of the faithful with a renewed amazement that we have a God who is so close to us and who has such a deep love for us that he comes to us in flesh and blood. Active participation in Mass is an occasion for all of us to avail ourselves of the immeasurable spiritual graces Christ desires for his faithful through his Paschal Sacrifice.

Human resources recommends that in-person meetings be conducted remotely via Zoom, RingCentral Meetings, MS Teams, etc. at least through April 14, 2021. Only essential employees who cannot complete work remotely should return to the building. While in the office, continue other COVID-19 protocols such as wearing masks, social distancing at least 6 feet, frequent hand washing, and using hand sanitizer.

Just like everyone else, I've listened to my share of sermons. One sermon I heard at the beginning of Lent one year at another parish has sort of stuck with me. The pastor there said that Lent was about evaluating our relationships and fixing them where they needed fixing.

The first relationship is with ourselves. Are we taking care of ourselves. Are we getting enough sleep? Are we eating the right things? Are we exercising? Are we doing anything that stimulates our brains? Have we had a checkup with our doctor or our dentist lately? Are we taking any medications like we should?

The second relationship is with others. Do we need to be reconciled with anyone? Are we a good spouse? A good parent? A good child to an aging parent? Do we earn our paycheck? Are we a good neighbor? A good citizen? Do we take time to vote?

The third relationship is with our parish. Are we as active in the parish as we can? Do we participate in any of the parish activities? Are we a lay-minister if we are able? Do we contribute to the support of the parish routinely?

The final relationship is with God. Do we attend Mass? Do we routinely receive the sacraments? Do we take time to pray? Do we participate at Mass, or are we merely occupying space in a pew? Are we taking Lent seriously?

The pandemic has made it hard to live up to some of the questions, for sure. Still, Lent is a time of personal reflection and an opportunity to get back on track.

Someone asked if I was still walking. I've taken a hit of sorts in my mileage during the cold spell, coupled with some other activities I had to tend to. Instead of breaking forty miles a week, I've had to settle on breaking 30. Spring is coming and daylight will be longer. The cold snap will not last forever, I hope.
