WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is the season of preparation for Easter. The General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar say: "Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. For the Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery: catechumens, through the several stages of Christian initiation; the

faithful, through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices" (27).

HOW LONG DOES LENT LAST?

Lent is traditionally described as being a 40-day period, reminding us of the 40 days Christ spent in the desert after his baptism in the Jordan. Counting the 40 days, however, is a bit complicated. Lent once began on the First Sunday of Lent, and there was not fasting on Sundays, leaving only 34 fast days. To get 40, the church added the two days of the paschal fast (Good Friday and Holy Saturday) and ten added four more days to the beginning of Lent. Today, the season begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the start of the Triduum on Holy Thursday evening. That totals 44 days, if you include Sundays. So the first four days of Lent stand now as a kind of warm-up for the 40 days.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF LENT?

The history of this season gives us some clues. Lent developed in the fourth century from three sources that merged.

- The first was an ancient pascal fast that originally lasted two days but was gradually lengthened.
- The second was the catechumenate, the process of preparation for baptism, which included intense periods of preparation for the initiation sacraments to be celebrated at Easter.
- The third was the order of the penitents, a process modeled on the catechumenate that sought a second conversion for those who had fallen into serious sin after baptism.

As the catechumens entered their final period of preparation for baptism, the penitents and the rest of the community accompanied them on their journey and prepared to renew their baptismal vows at Easter. That's a pretty good description of the purpose of Lent today. It is the final periods of preparation for the Elect, and the rest of the community supports them by their prayer and fasting. In the process, those already baptized prepare to renew their own baptismal commitment.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Saturday: 3:30 P.M. or by appointment by calling the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Infant Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements at least one month prior to the desired date of Baptism. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic (that is attending Mass each weekend) and must be a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community for at least 3 months prior to the request. A baptism class is required.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking to be married at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish should contact the parish priest at least seven months prior to the desired date of marriage. Both members of the party must be free to marry, at least one must be baptized Catholic and a registered member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community. Only the parish priest may confirm a date for a wedding at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please call the Parish Office to request this Sacrament. You do not need to wait until the person is actively dying to call.

FUNERALS

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday normally.


