The Israelites are grumbling again. What is their problem? No matter what God does for them, they are never satisfied. A nation out of a childless couple? Check. A land for a race of wanderers to call their own? No problem. Rescue from famine into the abundance of Egypt? You got it. Rescue from Egypt when a good deal goes sour?

Sure thing. A sea parted when helpful, and restored to its vigor just in time? Absolutely. A divine law to guide them? God is on it. The divine presence indwelling in their community? God is happy to come along for the ride.

Still they grumble. These ungrateful people sound so much like ourselves. Now it's water; next it's bread; later it's meat. All they have to do is ask: Give us this day our daily bread, and it is done. Don't they know that?

Thirteen hundred years later, Jesus teaches the prayer to his disciples, who

evidently still don't know that daily bread is one of God's routine commitments. It is there for the asking. Yet we don't ask. We choose to grumble.

What are we looking for this Lent? To get closer to God? To stop a bad habit or practice a virtue? To lose a few pounds? We have to be serious about our goal. We can't get closer to God. He is in us and all around us. Getting closer to God's will might be a better goal because that alignment is often very far off. If we find ourselves complaining that Lent is not working, that the magic feeling is not there this year, then maybe the answer is to practice a new consciousness. Seek the presence of God in every person you meet and every place you go. Keep searching with your eyes, your mind, your heart. If we practice believing what we profess—that God is in our midst—we may encounter Jesus at the well ourselves.

Mass, Stations, Confession, Fish Fries, Bible Challenge. All of these can help us walk closer with Jesus.

Despite the horrible storms we had the first two Fridays of the Fish Fry, the numbers were decent. On February 24 we had 397 and March 3 we had 315. We had cold, snow, ice and travel advisories but people still came and enjoyed a delicious dinner.

As of March 1, our food pantry faces a new potential challenge. The Federal S.N.A.P. Program has significantly reduced its monthly benefit. The reduction in benefit combined with the rising cost of groceries and household items will most likely lead to an increase in the number of people calling on our food pantry for help.

In that same vein, our SVDP Chapter is seeing an increase in people asking for help with rent and utilities. The average monthly rent charge continues to spiral upward, and DTE has recently announced that it will be seeking a rate hike from the State. There is a double whammy of sorts involved here because the Chapter is low on funds, as I suspect that the surrounding chapters are too. Our chapter has been meeting needs by "twinning" with neighboring chapters, but its not clear how long that practice can continue.

I can speak from personal experience that we are not situated in the lap of luxury. The demands are just as hard on us. I often have to take a breath when I check out of the grocery store at my food bill, and I'm shopping for one and shopping from a fairly strict list. Nonetheless, I am putting out the appeal to the parish to help both groups to the extent that people can. Both groups will truly appreciate any donation of grocery/household items or funds that it may receive and will be diligent and watchful about how they distribute our donations. Not everybody can help, but if you are able, please help.


