The girl accepted the offer but added, "First I'd like you to take me where my mother is." She directed the man to a cemetery where she placed the rose on a freshly dug grave. After dropping the girl off, the man returned to the flower shop, cancelled the order he had placed, got back into his car, and made the 225 mile trip to his mother's home where he personally delivered a bouquet of flowers purchased at a local store.

These days there are so many shortcuts available to accommodate our busy lifestyles: we can wire flowers, we can send electronic cards via email, we can call long distance, and we can even send digital photos through the computer. However, the most valuable gift we can give is a portion of ourselves — our presence — to that other person. It is the gift that is most appreciated and always remembered.

God has given us many stars to shine, many flowers to bloom, and many friends to cherish, but only one MOTHER to love.

May all our mothers, living and deceased, always know how much they are loved and appreciated every day of the year.

Judging by the child's and the parents' apparent ages, my guess is that this year will mark the first time this mom will be an honoree for Mother's Day. Here's to new mothers everywhere.

My mother had seven of us. Based on my experience of raising two, I don't know how she did it. We had to be a challenge. She's with us in spirit now on Mother's Day. She passed away somewhere in the vicinity of 35 years ago. Ironically she suffered a massive heart attack while riding in the family car to a rosary service for another relative. Here's to mothers every where who seemed to have raised us all while somehow having a life of their own. And here's to all the mothers with us in spirit today.

Kathy and I had two sons together. They are both adopted. When Kathy was a young woman in her twenties and still a single woman she developed a severe case of endometriosis and required a hysterectomy. The surgery solved one problem for sure but more or less lead to a series of other problems as she grew older. She never complained and loved our sons dearly, especially the grandchildren, but I have a husband's inkling that she deeply mourned not being able to have children of her own. Here's to adoptive mothers and foster mothers and grandmothers and aunts and older sisters who become mothers of other people's children, but raise them as their own.

My sister Tina had two children, Jeffrey and Jennifer. Jeff is in his late twenties and on the verge of being declared Dr. Hudson with a doctorate in Geology. His specialty is identifying new sources of drinkable water. Jennifer died when she was four. Jennifer was born catastrophically ill and given a life expectancy of about four years. It was suggested to Tina that Jennifer be placed in an institution. Tina brought her home to Marysville and raised her for those four short years. The saddest funerals we conduct are for children with surviving mothers. It's a part of life, but not a happy one. Here's to all the mothers who have lost children. Our hearts go out to you.

And here's to my two daughters-in-law, Soojin and Audrey, who have given me five grandchildren between them. Five is not as many as my mother had, but we were all born in a society that was much more ordered than theirs. The family tree continues to grow. In better times, I routinely visited a resident of a nursing home who had 13 kids and 52 grandchildren. What impressed me most was she knew not only the names of the grandkids bur also in what family they belonged. Here's to our daughters and daughters-in-law who bring us special joy and give us a chance to have a legacy.

Here's to veteran mothers everywhere. Here's to single mothers who take on the task of raising kids on their own. And here's to women who dreamed to be mothers and were never able to see their dream come true. Happy Mother's Day to you all.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Saturday: 3:30 P.M. or by appointment by calling the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Infant Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements at least one month prior to the desired date of Baptism. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic (that is attending Mass each weekend) and must be a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community for at least 3 months prior to the request. A baptism class is required.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking to be married at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish should contact the parish priest at least seven months prior to the desired date of marriage. Both members of the party must be free to marry, at least one must be baptized Catholic and a registered member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community. Only the parish priest may confirm a date for a wedding at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please call the Parish Office to request this Sacrament. You do not need to wait until the person is actively dying to call.

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday normally.

Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

A prayer for Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,


