Dear Parishioners,

Last Tuesday, May 26, St. Thomas resumed public Masses. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for everyone to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new “normal” together. For those unable to attend Mass in person, we will continue to provide weekend Masses on our parish website.

Some changes you will notice:

- People must wear a mask in church. Please bring your own if possible.
- People must sanitize their hands when entering church. Please bring your own if possible.
- We will practice social distancing. Some pews will be roped off. Tape on the floor spaced 6 feet apart. Please don't sit together unless you live in the same house. Please do not use the hymnals if you see them.
- A new way of the collection will be implemented.
- You may wear gloves but not to receive Holy Communion.
- We ask that everyone receive Communion in the hand.
- There will be no Sign of Peace before Communion.
- We will only distribute the Host for Holy Communion.
- The minister will purify their hands if they touch your hands or tongue.
- We will use the Fr. Prus Room if needed for social distancing.
- We may have an outside Mass in summer if weather permits.

The dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all the faithful through Sunday, September 6, 2020. Although the faithful are dispensed from their Sunday obligation to attend Mass, they must observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection (an excellent way to do this is through participating in a broadcast of the Sunday Mass) or participating in a spiritual or corporal act of mercy.

#### **WHO SHOULD NOT ATTEND MASS:**

- Those who are older than 65 years old (the recommended CDC age), with a compromised health condition or caring for the sick in any way, are encouraged to stay home.
- Anyone who is ill, has a temperature, cough, etc., should stay home as an act of justice to the whole community.

As every parish realizes, it will not be perfect. It will take time to adjust to a new way of attending church during this time when we need to distance ourselves and take many precautions. All of us will have to be open to changes and go with the flow.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

## This N That by Deacon Skip

There is no doubt in my mind that each of us has been inconvenienced significantly by the pandemic. To me, the biggest inconvenience has been the idleness. I'm used to being involved in parish activities, along with home visits and funeral home work, along with some other volunteer activities. Those activities don't include dealing to various and sundry family matters. Suddenly, there is next to nothing to do.

I've been doing my best to not fill the void with television. Besides, there is only so many times I can watch Ben and Erin, Chip and Joanna, and the property brothers fix a house. And, there is only so much of The View I can handle.

I've been filling my time with walking and hiking. I exceed four miles a day now. I define walking as involving a sidewalk through a settled area. I consider hiking to involve a dirt path through the woods. I'm used to both. I used to walk a mile to grade school everyday. I've hiked the Appalachian Trail in New England and the Shenandoah; I've hiked the Greenstone Ridge on Isle Royale.

I think I've mentioned before that there is a nature preserve behind Holliday Park property. It runs along Tonquish Creek, and I've been in there on many an occasion. On Memorial Day weekend I decided to do some exploring to see if I could find a side entrance to the preserve. I had noticed bicycle tracks and was sure the kids had made it into the preserve from the neighborhood. A side entrance would be far more graceful than vaulting the guard rail on Wayne Road.

As I walked the trail, the more I went downstream with the creek, the muddier and more flooded the trail became. It was becoming harder and harder to actually see a trail. I reached a point where I knew it was just not safe to venture much farther. Another creek would soon merge with Tonquish Creek and my passage would be blocked. When I turned around to walk back, I could not see a clear path. With all the mud and water, I had probably wandered off the true trail.

I stood there for a couple of moments then realized that as long as I kept Tonquish Creek on my shoulder and walked upstream I would find my way out and be back to Wayne Road. I did that and before long, as I guessed, spotted the path out to Wayne Road.

Not to be overly metaphorical, but sometimes life is like walking the creek trail to find an easier way, only to find that we've placed ourselves in the potential for trouble. I would suggest that as we walk our trail of life, we always keep God on our side to help us stay on the true path.

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Saturday: 3:30 P.M. or by appointment by calling the parish office.

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Infant Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements at least one month prior to the desired date of Baptism. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic (that is attending Mass each weekend) and must be a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community for at least 3 months prior to the request. A baptism class is required.

### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking to be married at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish should contact the parish priest at least seven months prior to the desired date of marriage. Both members of the party must be free to marry, at least one must be baptized Catholic and a registered member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community. Only the parish priest may confirm a date for a wedding at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish.

### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please call the Parish Office to request this Sacrament. You do not need to wait until the person is actively dying to call.

### FUNERALS

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday normally.

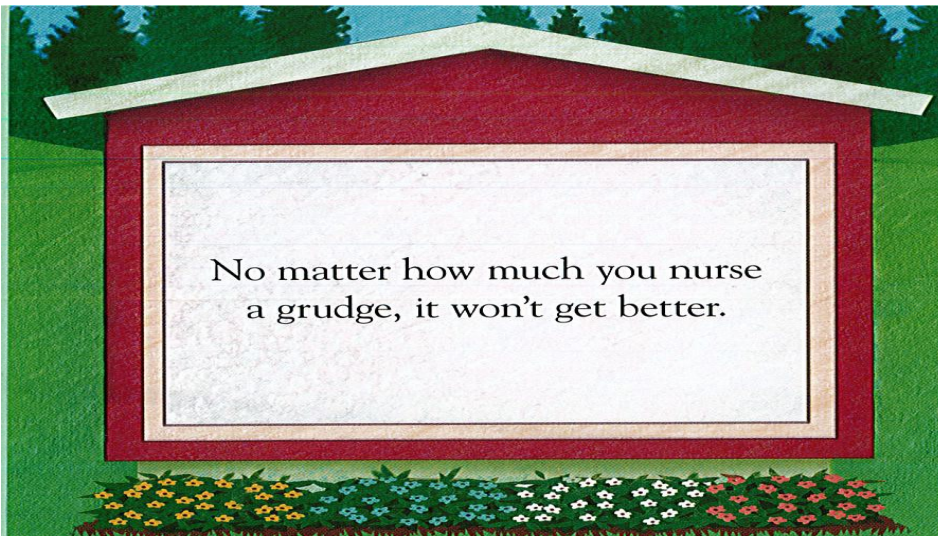

## From the Desk of... Father Larry

Last weekend Jesus gave us the Great Commission to preach the Gospel by the way we live as He ascended to the Father to prepare a place for each of us. Today, on Pentecost, we pray: "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your people, and kindle in them the

fire of your love, and you shall renew the face of the earth."

Pentecost calls us to change our hearts. Especially this year, in the wake of disease and loss, we may break down walls and barriers that keep us apart. We may even change harsh opinions of another's ministry. The Church desperately needs us to minister to one another—and together. Pentecost challenges us to ask for such a change in our hearts, a rendering of the heart that is never easy.

The Holy Spirit desires the best for us, to become people of sincere faith, hope and love. Pentecost once again reminds us to ask for everything we need to love and serve God as we love and serve one another and all people. ### Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

#### A prayer for Spiritual Communion

*My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.*

*I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul.*

*Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,*

*Come at least spiritually into my heart.*

*I embrace you as if you were already there*

*And unite myself wholly to you.*

*Never permit me to be separated from you.*

*Amen.*
