This past Sunday we observed the feast of Pentecost, one of the major feast days of the Church year. One of the readings from the Vigil Mass comes from the book of Genesis and is a telling of the story of the Tower of Babel.


The story is fairly well known. The people decide to build a tower that reaches to the sky. God stops the construction by causing everyone to speak a different language. Like our Biblical ancestors we look to our own achievements and forget and ignore the presence of God in our lives. Not only that, we speak to one another but do not understand one another. It has become as if we each speak a language that only we understand. And have little regard for what someone else says.

It is time to remember the presence of God in our lives. It is time to hear and understand the words of others.
