



Happy Feast Day! St. Thomas the Apostle July 3

Surprisingly the expression "a Doubting Thomas" refers to an apostle who made one of the clearest professions of faith in Jesus in the whole Gospel.

Thomas was most likely a Galilean fisherman, like Peter, James, and John. Jesus called him, and he followed loyally. One day a messenger came to tell Jesus that his friend Lazarus was quite sick. Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, asked Jesus to come and cure their brother. The apostles knew this would be a dangerous trip for Jesus because he had many enemies in the area around Jerusalem. But Thomas said he would be very glad to go with Jesus and even to die with him.

On Easter Sunday evening, when the apostles reported that the risen Lord Jesus had appeared to them, Thomas could hardly believe them. He loved Jesus and wanted to see him again; he insisted that he would believe when he could put his finger into the wound in Jesus' side. He was referring to the wound that resulted when a soldier pierced Jesus' side with a spear while he was hung on the cross.

A week later Jesus appeared again to the apostles. This time Thomas was there. Jesus called him over and told him to put his finger into the would. Thomas fell to his knees and said, "My Lord and my God!" Then Jesus said something that should give us great courage and trust. He said to Thomas, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe" (John 20:29).

We do not know for sure what happened to Thomas later on. Tradition says that he went to India and preached there. The Catholic people of India believe firmly that he is their special apostle and patron.

Many Catholics repeat Thomas's profession of faith, "My Lord and my God," during the eucharistic prayer when the priest holds up the consecrated bread.
