He is credited with introducing folk music into Catholic Masses with his 1965 album "Mass for Young Americans," an album that stirred the earliest of contemporary Christian music. He was a pastoral musician regarded as "the father of the guitar Mass." His first album sold millions of copies in the 1960s and '80s and was translated into 28 languages. He recorded 12 albums of Christian music that reenergized the faith and social consciousness of millions of people in the decades following Vatican II.

May he rest in peace. May he sing with the choirs of angels for all eternity!
