family responsibilities of other months. Our vacations, whenever we take them, should include time to "come to Jesus" and be yoked with him. His promised gift to his faithful followers is peace, a synonym for rest.

In addition to barbecues and beaches we should try to find opportunities for solitude and silence — and the Son as well as the sun. Solitude allows Jesus to

get through to us, past the noisy throng with all their demands that often keep him at a distance from us. Silence allows us to hear Jesus whispering to us, something which at times the inane chatter of others prevents us from fully hearing. The spiritual writers of past centuries used to write of "otium," sacred leisure. Our yearly vacation (it comes from the Latin for "empty") to be a real vacation, must incorporate a good dose of this.

Finally, on the Fourth of July weekend we should be especially grateful as we gather a community of believers to worship, for the many freedoms our pioneers fought for and legislated for us. They called them "God-given" rights. Events of recent years have reminded us, or maybe alerted us for the first time, how many people there on this planet today, especially women and children, who lack the basic liberties we Americans often take so much for granted.

The Covid-19 problem drags on. I'm a little worried that it is coming back with a vengeance. I've been doing my best to stay busy. I've clocked a couple of 9 mile walking days in the past week. I've been doing my best to not be a slave to the TV in my down time, but I do admit that I have become a fan of sorts of HGTV. That's the channel that has all the home improvement shows.

I am sort of awe struck by the shows. First, I have a hard time relating to the amount of money couples are able to spend on remodeling a house. I think the most Kathy and I ever spent was about \$3,000 and had to get a home improvement loan to do that. It's nothing for a TV couple to say they can spend \$250,000. All of our houses combined over our life together do not equal that much.

I also stand in awe at the size of the houses people look at or remodel. It is common to see couples talk about a 4000 sq foot house as cramped. The first house I remember as a kid was on Memorial Street in Detroit. It was 750 sq feet. When we reached 5 kids, Mom and Dad moved us to a bigger house on Littlefield. When we reached our last house on Outer Drive near Fenkell, there were seven of us kids.

The first house Kathy and I bought was on James Street in Garden City. It was allegedly 750 sq. feet. It was the Palace of Versailles compared to the upper flat in Dearborn where we had been living. Eventually we moved to bigger house with 1200 sq. feet. That one had three bedrooms, so each of the boys had a room of their own. Buckingham Palace.

The other thing that catches my attention is the remodeling of houses to the "open" concept. My mother was extremely proud of the Littlefield house because the first floor had a den, a dining room, a living room, a breakfast nook, and a kitchen with a door. Mom would have been aghast, to be polite, if anyone came into the kitchen while she was cooking. In most of the remodeling shows, the first floor is turned into one big room, sort of the gym look. Times have changed.

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.
