These last six months have been life-changing. During this pandemic, we watched normalcy as we knew it just slip by. Who would have ever imagined a time in which our churches would be closed, parking lots would be empty on Sundays, and priests would be unable, or at the very least, restricted from doing what we are ordained to do. Who

could even fathom that the main staple of our faith —the holy Eucharist— would be unavailable to our faithful for such an extended time?

Now that most of our churches have reopened, we can take heart in being with the faithful again and experiencing that powerful sense of community. Nevertheless, this experience is very different as there are masks, social distancing and fewer people, empty holy water fonts, no hymnals or choir, no offertory procession or baskets being passed for the collection, and no sense of touch with the sign of peace.

I don't know about you, but I have found two real changes in my prayer life. First, I have come to see, like never before, that I am not in control in any way. As a

consequence, my prayer consistently in these months has been one of deep surrender. I find myself saying what we say every night at prayer, "Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit." I also find myself echoing the prayer of St. Ignatius of Loyola asking God to receive my "memory, understanding and will" and bestow upon me his "love and grace," for that is all I need.

Second, my prayer in these painstaking months has become all the more about gratitude. As we watch how the virus has claimed so many lives worldwide, it is all the more clear to me that every moment, every day, is a gift, and that one of the take-aways in all of this is that we simply and humbly need to behold the now and gratefully live in the present moment.

A week or so ago, on one of my walking journeys, I wandered into a cemetery on Ann Arbor Trail near Levan. I was quite surprised to see that many of the dates of death on the tombstones went back to the time before the Civil War and many of those people were born in the 1700s. This triggered a trip to the Garden City Historical Society where I received a packet of maps of the territory.

The first map dated back to the 1700s. The part of Garden City north of what became Ford Rd was considered heavily timbered. This suggests a logging operation. South of Ford and East of Merriman was considered heavily forested and West of Merriman was considered marshy and wet. The area was listed as populated with deer, bears, and wolves, which is a far cry from skunks, possums, and raccoons that Kathy and I knew when we lived in Garden City.


To the north was a path described as an Indian Trail. Cowan sort of follows that path. There was a community of sorts along Merriman and North of Warren called Perrinville, about where Hawthorne Valley used to be. Perrinville would become the city that never happened. Several cities sprang up around, but Perrinville never made it to being an independent municipality.

A subsequent map shows a series of land grants made by President Andrew Jackson before Michigan became a state. The most prominent family name that jumps out is Lathers. Andy Jackson had nothing to do whatsoever with the founding of St. Thomas the Apostle, but the parish property sits on what was a farm built on one of those land grants, probably belonging to the Fowlen family.

I was quite surprised to see how far back the area went. I had assumed that the area was 1900s farm land that eventually was developed into subdivisions to accommodate the GI's returning from WWII. Instead we are history.

The garage sale is still taking donations.

Don't forget the food pantry. They publish an article in the bulletin weekly listing their needs. The food basket is still available in the gathering area of the church and the pantry is open for receiving donations on Thursday morning at 10.

Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

NEW FORMAT FOR RELIGIOUS FORMATION!!

We hold the safety and health of our families as our single most important priority. With this in mind, I am excited to announce a new style of learning to begin the Religious Formation year insuring the well being of all as we continue our faith journey! We will be having a HYBRID style formation through at least the end of the year. **HOW WILL THIS WORK?** Families are asked to join with their children in a prayer service and materials pick-up once a month in the church. They will receive all materials needed to share their faith with their children in the safety of their own homes, with online support and ZOOM meetings throughout that month. Our currently scheduled date to return is Monday, September 28th at 6:00pm. We will have a brief prayer service and a staggered releasing of children by grades into the Father Prus Hall for material pick up. We are doing everything we can to insure that everyone feels safe with the plan to implement our return to learning. With that said, we are still accepting registrations for the upcoming Religious Formation year. Forms have been mailed to our existing families who had students enrolled in the program this past school year. The forms are also available on our website, and in the Gathering Space of the Church. I can always send them by email to those interested as well. Please remember it is NEVER too late to sign children up for this program. We have catchup classes for those who have not had previous catechesis. We look at each case on an individual basis. We look forward to working with our families who continue to be the first catechists for their children within the domestic church.
