



The Serenity Prayer is attributed to Reinhold Niebuhr, a twentieth-century Protestant theologian who taught for thirty years at Union Theological Seminary in New York. The first three lines of the prayer are very well known, often featured on wall plaques and prayed by Twelve-Step recovery groups worldwide:

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, Courage to change the things I can, And the wisdom to know the difference.

There is much wisdom in just those first few lines. The prayer continues:

Living one day at a time,
Enjoying one moment at a time,
Accepting hardship as a pathway to peace,
Taking, as Jesus did,
This sinful world as it is,
Not as I would have it,
Trusting that you will make all things right
If I surrender to your will,
So that I may be reasonably happy in this life
And supremely happy with you forever in the next.

After my eye exam, the doctor declared I needed glasses, probably 4 years earlier. What I do remember the most was wearing the glasses home from the doctor's office a week later. For the first time in a long time, I could see the names on the corner street signs and could see individual leaves on the trees. Glasses have been my companion for over 60 years now.


