### Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

#### A prayer for Spiritual Communion

*My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.  
I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul.  
Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,  
Come at least spiritually into my heart.  
I embrace you as if you were already there  
And unite myself wholly to you.  
Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.*

**NEW FORMAT FOR**  
**RELIGIOUS FORMATION!!**

We hold the safety and health of our families as our single most important priority. With this in mind, I am excited to announce a new style of learning to begin the Religious Formation year insuring the well being of all as we continue our faith journey! We will be having a HYBRID style formation through at least the end of the year. **HOW WILL THIS WORK?** Families are asked to join with their children in a prayer service and materials pick-up once a month in the church. They will receive all materials needed to share their faith with their children in the safety of their own homes, with online support and ZOOM meetings throughout that month. Our currently scheduled date to return is Monday, September 28th at 6:00pm. We will have a brief prayer service and a staggered releasing of children by grades into the Father Prus Hall for material pick up. We are doing everything we can to insure that everyone feels safe with the plan to implement our return to learning. With that said, we are still accepting registrations for the upcoming Religious Formation year. Forms have been mailed to our existing families who had students enrolled in the program this past school year. The forms are also available on our website, and in the Gathering Space of the Church. I can always send them by email to those interested as well. Please remember it is NEVER too late to sign children up for this program. We have catch-up classes for those who have not had previous catechesis. We look at each case on an individual basis. We look forward to working with our families who continue to be the first catechists for their children within the domestic church. Please do not hesitate to call me if you have any questions or concerns.



**CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD**

We would normally be starting our Children's Liturgy of the Word at our 11am Mass; but to insure the safety of all, we will be postponing this until a time when we feel more comfortable gathering as a small group. CLOW is a program where young ones gather in the Father Prus Hall to learn about the Scripture through fun activities and lessons. Until we're able to come together for CLOW, there will be printed activities that can be found in the Gathering Space for parents to take home and use to work with their children helping them to understand the readings each week. They are located just outside the entrance to the Father Prus Hall in the wooden organizer. Please look for the CLOW sign. We hope to resume this wonderful way to bring the Word to our young people just as soon as possible! Until then, our goal is to help provide materials to parents in joining with them as they continue to be the first catechists to their children! **Another great resource** is our Children's Lending Library located just outside the Usher's Room in the Gathering Space. This spot is FILLED with Arch books describing great stories from Scripture in a format that is easy for children to understand. We also offer many materials for adults. Take a peek and see what valuable things we have!

We will be holding another Altar Server training event this fall. Children who have completed the third grade and older are eligible to participate in this awesome way to serve our parish. We are also seeking adult servers to serve with our young people. If this is something that interests you, it might just be God calling you to His service. Please pray on this wonderful opportunity!
