

The season of Autumn is in full swing. The month of October is upon us as we mark many dates. As Catholics, the month is dedicated to respect Life and to the Rosary. October 4th is the Feast of St. Francis of Assissi, a favorite saint of many people. The blessing of pets took place this Saturday, October 5th. October 28th is the feast of St. Jude, another favorite saint of many people.

St. Francis loved all life as the visible sign of its Maker. It was Francis who taught the world to see God in everything; the chirp of the birds, the stillness of the forest, the beauty of flowers, the solitude of the rocks. The very animals became his "sisters and brothers."

Francis is the model of animal care and the patron saint of veterinarians. As a humble steward of God's creation, he never abused, misused, or willfully hurt any animals.

Today there are hundreds of organizations in the United States aimed at preventing the mistreatment of animals. Most sprang from the original American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) founded in 1866. Today the ASPCA's main work is the maintenance of shelters and hospitals for abandoned, neglected and wounded animals.

Francis had a great love for animals and all creation. He reminds us, however, that it is a mistake to equate them with human beings. Animal's are God's creatures put on earth to serve people in hundreds of ways from guarding homes, driving cattle, to keeping us company.

We are stewards of the world and all its creatures. We must guard against any tendency to mistreat animals or any of God's creation, least we become cruel to people as well. Abortions, child abuse and killing the sick and elderly are examples of sin against human life. Bullying, gossiping, slander, arrogance are a few examples that express little regard for the dignity and sacredness of God's gift of human life.

On Tuesday September 24, at approximately 4 P.M., at Maryview Hospital in Portsmouth, Virginia, my brother Ken passed away. He had contracted a particularly virulent form of cancer known as Multiple Myeloma. He underwent treatment and appeared to be making progress toward recovery, then did a complete U-turn. He went from recovering to deceased in less than a week. Ken was 64.

After graduating high school, Ken entered the U.S. Navy where he served as a corpsman, first at the U.S. Naval Academy, then on sea duty aboard the U.S.S. Canisteo, out of the naval base in Norfolk. When he left the service, because at the time there were limited job opportunities in his home town of Detroit, he remained in Norfolk, going to work at Norfolk General as an orderly. He went back to school and became an R.N., serving in the ER at Norfolk General for almost his entire professional life. At one point, he very briefly was coaxed into private practice, but out of boredom, returned to the ER.

Ken was born when I was six. Although my sister Christine predates him by three years, he is the first sibling I remember being an infant. He is survived by his children Michael and Christine, my father and step-mother, and three brothers and three sisters.

I ask for your prayers for the repose of his soul, that he rests in the presence of God. I also ask for prayers for his son Michael who is developmentally challenged. Although Michael is 35, he functions at the level of a 10 yr. old. And finally, I ask for your prayers for my father who at age 96 must endure the pain of laying a child to rest. May God's angels carry my brother to heaven's gates; may the saints of God bring him to the face of God; may we meet again. He was a good man in the service of others.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Infant Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements at least one month prior to the desired date of Baptism. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic (that is attending Mass each weekend) and must be a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community for at least 3 months prior to the request. A baptism class is required.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking to be married at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish should contact the parish priest at least seven months prior to the desired date of marriage. Both members of the party must be free to marry, at least one must be baptized Catholic and a registered member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community. Only the parish priest may confirm a date for a wedding at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish.
