I flipped the page on my calendar at home and took a quick look to see what to expect in November. I noticed very quickly that the 11th is Veteran's Day. We have a number of Veterans in our parish; many are combat veterans. We are honored to have them among us.

While some vets will talk at length about their experiences, my observation is that most vets will not say anything unless they are asked directly and then say very little. We have parishioners who fought in the Pacific in WWII, participated in D-Day, who were Tuskegee Airmen. My father was Army Air Corp in Europe, and my father-in-law served on a destroyer in the China Sea. My father says little; my father-in-law said nothing. We stop for a moment and applaud the sacrifice of all men and women who have served their country in the military, not just in WWII, but at any time.

Traditionally we honor our deceased loved ones in November, as well. It was Kathy and my practice to place a vigil candle at the site of her family's graves at St. Hedwig every November. I keep the practice alive at St. Hedwig, but travel north, as well, to Holy Sepulcher to place a vigil candle at Kathy's grave. I am sure that every parishioner has a long list of relatives and friends who have left this earth, some recent and many long ago. Let it be our prayer that all our deceased loved ones rest in the presence of God.

On another topic: none of the parish ministries are "closed" to new members. There are plenty of opportunities for service, especially as Choir Member, Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Usher, Adult Server-you name it. If anyone has been thinking about becoming a minister, just call the office and leave a name and number, or snag me after Mass. If ministry does not suit someone, I think at last count there were close to 30 different organizations in the parish welcoming members.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Saturday: 3:00 P.M. or by appointment by calling the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Infant Baptisms are held on the second Sunday of each month. Please contact the parish office to make arrangements at least one month prior to the desired date of Baptism. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic (that is attending Mass each weekend) and must be a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community for at least 3 months prior to the request. A baptism class is required.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking to be married at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish should contact the parish priest at least seven months prior to the desired date of marriage. Both members of the party must be free to marry, at least one must be baptized Catholic and a registered member of the St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Community. Only the parish priest may confirm a date for a wedding at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please call the Parish Office to request this Sacrament. You do not need to wait until the person is actively dying to call.

FUNERALS

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday normally.

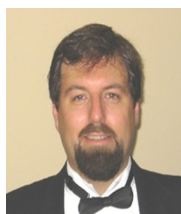

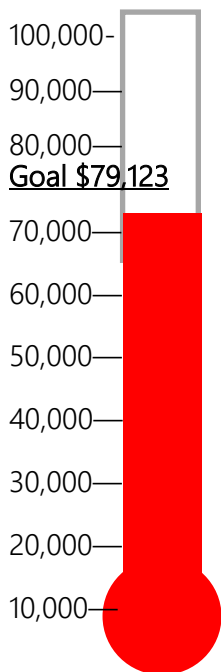

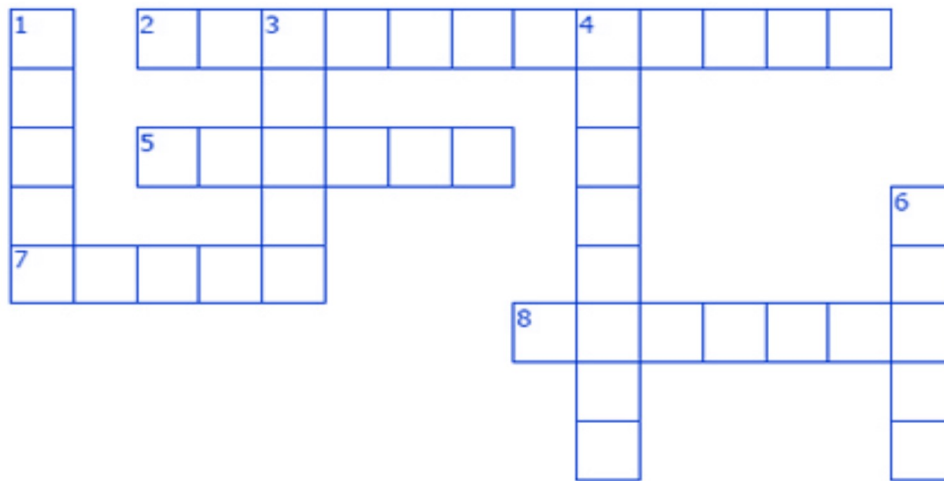
