

3rd Sunday of Advent

December 14, 2025



We see Advent as a time of joyful preparation. It is a season of decorating, baking, cleaning, shopping and waiting.

Years ago, Advent was not seen with such enthusiasm. It was a serious time. Not quite as penitential as Lent, Advent was a time for confession and spiritual reflection. Christmas decorations did not go up early. The Christmas Tree was decorated on Christmas Eve. The Christmas season and celebration did not begin until Midnight Mass

and continued until the Presentation of Jesus on February 2.

The pink candle, a sign that is Gaudete Sunday, lets us know that the time of preparation is almost over. We can allow a little bit of celebration on this Sunday to give us the patience we need to last a little while longer. The question for us is whether or not we even need this particular Sunday. Do we need a break from our serious preparations, or do we need a break from all the celebrating we have already been doing?

Are we already so tired that we cut out our spiritual preparations for Christmas? Do we take time for the anticipation of the season or are we busy with "other things"? Do we listen to music that reflects the birth of our Savior or just secular "holiday music"? Have our decorations been up so long that we can't wait to take them down? Has Christmas shopping ceased being fun and become a chore? Does the pink candle make any sense in our preparation for Christmas? Do we reflect on this past year?

Advent means waiting for the coming of Jesus into our lives, recognizing His presence among us and being ready for His return at the end of time.

For the rest of Advent, we might want to become a little more observant. We might ask if the pink candle makes sense, and if it does not, find a way to give it meaning.


