February 14th is a special day in the calendar. It is of course commonly known in many places around the world as "Valentine's Day." It is great that so many millions of people of different faiths, or even of no faith at all, celebrate worldwide the feast day of a Catholic bishop and saint who died as a martyr on February 14th, 271 A.D. Of course, then again, I'm pretty sure that the vast majority of people have no idea that this is who St. Valentine is.

But how did this day become associated with romantic love? The truth is that St. Valentine's Day never really was associated with romantic love until the time of Geoffrey Chaucer in the High Middle Ages around the 14th century when the tradition of courtly love flourished. Nevertheless, there is one traditional account about St. Valentine that states that he was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians. According to legend, during his imprisonment, he healed the blind daughter of his jailer, Asterius. A later embellishment to this story states that before his execution he wrote her a letter signed, "Your Valentine" as a farewell.

During the 17th and 18th century in England, Valentine's Day eventually evolved into an occasion which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending handmade greeting cards which became known as "Valentines." Around 1800 the first commercial cards appeared. Cards were usually sent anonymously. As early as 1822, an English official reported having to hire extra postal workers on this day. In 1849, Esther Howland of Worcester, Massachusetts started selling high quality valentine cards here in the United States. They were so popular that she became known as the "Mother of the American Valentine."
