

Saint Lawrence

(d. 258)

"Where's the money?" demanded the Roman official harshly. Deacon Lawrence looked surprised by the question. "What money?" he asked. "The Church's gold and silver," answered the official. "We know that

you're in charge of the treasury, Lawrence. The government has a right to confiscate those funds. Hand them over." The official began to look annoyed. He had seen that Pope Sixtus II and four other deacons had been executed. But he didn't want to kill this deacon until he had the wealth in his hands. Lawrence responded, "Yes, I will show you the real treasures of the Church, but you have to give me time to prepare. Give me three days." Because he suspected that he, too, might be arrested, Lawrence had already sold the gold chalice and the other sacred items and had given the money to the poor.

But Lawrence was true to his promise. In three days the official returned. He saw before his eyes rows of lepers, orphans, widows, and people with disabilities. Lawrence's comment was "These are the treasures of the Church."

This incident that has come down from the early centuries shows how well Lawrence had put on the mind and heart of Christ. That special love he had for the weak, the helpless, and those whom others rejected, and the special dignity he saw in each person made him an excellent deacon. The deacons in the Church were to serve others, especially the poor. Lawrence valued the poor more than he did his own life.

The Roman official was so angry with Lawrence that he had a huge grill built and placed over burning coals. In this way, he hoped that Lawrence would die very slowly and painfully from the burning heat. But Lawrence was filled with good humor and joy while he died. Tradition says that he quipped, "I'm done on this side. Turn me over." The onlookers were amazed. But how could they understand that Lawrence was happy and excited about seeing the most important person in his life face to face—Jesus Christ?

A little five-year-old was having her lunch while her mother was trying to coax some ketchup out of the bottle by hitting it on the bottom with her hand. The phone rang, and the mother asked, "Honey, will you please answer the phone?" The little girl picked up the phone. "Hello. No, my mommy can't come to the phone right now because she's hitting the bottle."

She married when she was 19. She and her husband came to the US and were naturalized. She sponsored 30 others to emigrate to the US.


