

Diversity Grant

The annual Arizona Education Association Diversity Grant offers opportunities to develop and pursue instructional programs or curriculum that promote diversity, tolerance, and respect for humankind.

ELIGIBILITY:

- The recipient(s) must be an AEA member or team of AEA members
- One annual grant in an amount up to \$1,000 may be awarded for:
 - Developing and implementing a curriculum that promotes diversity in an educational setting;
 - Developing and implementing an instructional program that promotes a positive atmosphere, tolerance, respect, and global appreciation for all humankind; or,
 - Creatively utilizing a diversity curriculum to increase student achievement.

GUIDELINES:

1. No party may submit more than one nomination per year.
2. Applications shall be submitted on the AEA Diversity Grant application. Supplemental materials submitted with the application will not be returned.
3. Once a party has received the grant, it may not apply again for the same curriculum, program, or activity.
4. A grant may not be used for capital equipment purchases.
5. Applications may be submitted by any AEA member, local association, committee, or task force.
6. The AEA Board of Directors or their designee shall receive the applications and determine the grant recipient. The AEA Board of Directors may not select recipient(s).
7. The grant recipient will receive the award at the annual AEA Foundation Salute to Excellence ceremony.
