

*During WWI and WWII, ladies working as volunteers for the Salvation Army set up "soup kitchen" type outlets near the front lines to serve soldiers on duty. Instead of serving soup, however, they served hot sweet donuts, giving war weary Americans a morale boost.

*When the war ended, men returning home clamored for donuts, contributing to their burgeoning popularity. Today, the Salvation Army continues to give out the Golden Doughnut Award to honot citizens who exemplify the good works of the Salvation Army.

*In 1920, the first successful donut-making machine was invented after a dozen unsuccessful models. The creator, a Bussian immigrant named Adolph Levitt, dubbed the all-in-one contraption "the Wonderful Almost Human Automatic Donut Machine." Ingredients went in one end, and donuts came out the other. Crowds assembled in front of Levitt's New York bakery storefront to watch the spectacle, and he sold 128 of his machines in the first year. This was just the beginning of Levitt's donut empire. He sold thousands of the machines to corner cafes, roadside eateries and local bakeries worldwide.

"It was Levitt who first made a concerted effort to change the spelling from "doughnut" to "donut." Many of his customers were not proficient in English and had trouble pronouncing "dough." "Dunkin Donuts adopted the simpler spelling for their nationwide chain of franchises. Today, both spellings are considered correct. At the 1934 World's Fair in Chicago, the display showing donuts being turned out by an automated machine was a big hit. During the Great Depression, donuts were a sweet treat that nearly everyone could afford, with a dozen selling for five cents.

*Dunking donuts in coffee or milk came about as a result of an accident. Hollywood starlet Mae Murray dropped a donut into her coffee by mistake while dining out at an upscale New York eatery. Not wanting her to feel embarrassed, her companion dropped his into his cup as well.

Clark Gable made dunking fashionable in a scene in Frank Capra's 1934 movie "It Happened One Night" in which he teaches actress Claudette Colbert how to properly dunk her donut in a cup of coffee.

"At one time, the Dunkin' Donuts chain offered a donut shaped like a Q, with a "handle" meant to facilitate dunking. It was discontinued because it had to be handcut and people tended to dunk the handle first.

WEIRD DONUTS

*Dolicious Donuts, a bakery in Canada, was once known for some of the world's most expensive donuts. The "Donutopia" was glazed with chocolate-balsamic vinegar icing, sprinkled with real gold flakes and sugar crystals shaped like diamonds, and filled with wine-infused cream. Even the water used to craft it, called Bling H2Q, cost \$39 per bottle. The donuts sold for \$100 each and proceeds were "donutted" to a local soup kitchen. Unfortunately the bakery is now defunct.





Voodoo Doughnut in in Portland, Oregon, used to sell donuts reputed to be glazed in NyQuil and others stuffed with Times and Pepto-Bismol, until local health officials stepped in. They also made the "Tex-Ass," which weighed a half-pound, equal to six regular donuts. It was free if you could eat the whole thing within 80 seconds. When a man choked to death on it, the donut was discontinued.

In a typical donut shop, it takes 55 minutes to create a donut from start to finish. It must fry for 85 seconds in hot grease. When it comes to dunking, a donut made of finely ground flour will hold more liquid than a donut made of course flour and will be less likely to break. Tip it in at an angle so the top remains dry, with just a quick dunk.

*Donuts are between 15 and 25% fat. Cake donuts are 15% sugar, while raised yeast donuts are only 3% sugar.

*The calorie count ranges from 200 for plain donuts (equal to toast with jam) to 500 for frosted or filled.

*The most popular donut in America is the cream-filled donut, followed by plain glazed donuts.

*Krispy Kreme donuts are kosher.

*About 20 million donuts are produced annually in a typical Krispy Kreme store.

FUN DONUTS

'A donut-related puff pastry similar to a donut hole is very popular in France. It is so light and fluffy that it's named "pet de nonne" which translates as "fart of the nun."

[†]The Spudnut is a potato-based donut made with potato starch or mashed potatoes instead of flour.

'A Polish donut called the Paczki contains a regional vodka. 'The Donut Hole in La Puente, California features two gigantic fiberglass donuts set on end, with a drive through donut factory connecting the two. Customers drive through the big donuts to pick up their favorite donuts. It's been an area landmark since 1968.

The 4 Deserts Ultramarathor Series is an annual event consisting of four separate 155-mile (250 km) marathon footraces, each taking place in a different desert around the world. It's been recognized as the world's ultimate encurance test. The four segments start with the "Gobi March" in the Gobi Desert, which straddles the border between Mongolia and China. Next is the "Atacama Crossing" in the Atacama Desert of Chile in South America. The third leg is the "Namib Race" in Namibia, Africa. The grand finale is "The Last Desert" located in Antarctica.

These locations are four of the world's biggest and most forbidding deserts. Runners must encure the driest, hottest, coldest, and windlest places on the planet, in a test that stretchesithem to their physical and mental limits.

This ultramarathon started with the first Gobi race in 2003. A new leg of the race was added each year after that. The first time all four races were held in a single year was 2006, and the tradition continues today.

Typically runners from about 40 different countries are present for each race, giving people a chance to meet competitors from many different regions of the world.

So far, over 70 races have been held, featuring over 10,000 runners representing over a hundred countries. Both men and women are allowed to race.

Runners are welcome to enter as many of the four competitions as they want. However, anyone who wants to compete in the Antarctica challenge is required to have completed at least two of the previous races.

Any contestant who completes all four legs becomes a member of the "4 Deserts Club." Anyone who completes all four races in the same year becomes a member of the exclusive "4 Desert Grand Slam Club."

Each 155-mile (250 km) race takes place over seven days. A campsite is erected every night, offering runners a place to sleep, hot water for washing, a campfire, medical care if needed, and an internet connection. Between camps, runners follow flags that mark the way, passing through checkpoints along the route where water and medical care are available. Other than these comforts, each person is responsible for carrying their own supplies, including their own food and equipment. In addition, they are given a list of mandatory survival supplies they must carry at all times.

The race begins at the appointed time each day. Runners must reach the end of that day's course within a set time to qualify to continue. Every person's run time is recorded daily and totalec at the finish line to determine the winner. Collective finish times over the seven-days range between 25 and 70 hours. The winner is awarded one point, the second-place finisher gets two points; the third-place winner gets three points, etc. When running all four races, the goal is to get the lowest possible score.

In 2010, South African runner Ryan Sandes did the impossible, winning each of the four legs of the race. He had a total score of 4, the lowest score possible. At the time, only 81 people had completed all four marathons, and only 11 had completed them in the same calendar year.

Each race also acts as a fundraiser, with a portion of the money raised going towards a local chariby.





MDMA study for PTSD

With money from the National Defense Authorization Act for 2024, a \$1.5 million grant program is deginning a study using Methylenediosymetham; thetamine-assisted (MDMA, also known as eestacy) psychedelic therapy for alcoholuse disorder (AUD) and post-tranmatic stress disorder (PTSD).

The Department of Veterans Affairs will hook up with researchers at Vale and Brown universities to use the drug along with psychotherapy. The goal, says a news release, is to use the drugs to linearease emotional openness, reduce fear and promote introspection during therapy. Test subjects will either be given the real dose or a low dose as a placebo.

The West Eaven VA Medical Center in Connecticut and the Providence VA. Medical Center in Rhode Island are the sites for the study, and they're starving S00II.

The standard PTSD treatment, using selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRI) doesn't work on approximately one third of people. The difference between the two (SSRI vs. MDMA) is how much serotonin is released. While the SSRI class of drugs blocks the release of serotonin, MDMA aids it, bringing feelings of euphoria ... hence the street name "ecstacy." ADMA isn't going to be the whole answer, however. Treatment will need ARIES (March 21 to April 19) Sharing the joys of the calebto be in conjunction with therapy and under highly controlled circumstances. In any event, it will be the first time since the 1960s that they've tried psychedelic-assisted therapy.

There are those who worry about going down this road, as well they should. Once it gets out that the VA is actually doing studies on using a street drug as a treatment, those who suffer from PTSD or AUD might decide to take matters into their own hands and self-medicate. The potential for disaster comes from the amount of the drug to be used. In therapy the amount will be minuscule. With a drug acquired on the street. there's no telling what's really in it, and there will be no accompanying

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

- On Jan. 6, 1975, "Wheel of Fortune," one of American television's longest-running syndicated game shows, debuted on NBC. Created by Mery Griffin, it was hosted for decades by Pat Sajak and Yanna White, the latter of whom often contributed her own puszles and was noted as apparently never wearing the same gown twice in more than 6,000 episodes.
- On Jan. 7, 1785, Frenchman Jean-Pierre Blanchard and American John Jeffries flew from Dover, England to Calais, France, in a gas balloon, becoming the first people to cross the English Channel by air, though they almost crashed into it along the way due to excess weight from objects that had to be jettisoned.

- On Jan. 11, 2010, Miep Cles, the last survivor of the small group that helped hide Anne Frank, her family and four others from the Nazis during World War II, died in the Netherlands at age 100.
- On Jan. 12, 1995, Malcolm X's daughter Qubitah Shabazz was arrested for conspiring to kill Louis Farrakhan, who she believed was responsible for her father's assassination. After she admitted her "responsibility," though not guilt, the government accepted a plea bargain.
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

Dion I conard was born in Australia in 1975. As an adult, he moved to Scotland and took up running. He began winning marathens. In June of 2016, and entered an ultra-marathon that changed his life.

The Gobi Murch is a week-long, 155-mile (250 km) maration in China's Gobi Deser.

The day before the race, Leonard noticed a day hanging around the camp. It was a female Chihuahua-terrier mix.

Leonard thought she lived nearby. However, when the race began the next day, the little dog started running along too. Leonard thought the dog would turn back as soon as she got fired but she kept up with the pack of over 100 marathor ers as they made their way through the 23 mile (37 km) route of the first day's course.

The next day the finy dog decided to run next to Leonard, staying doggedly at his side. Leonard shared some of his food with her at the end of the day. She slept with him in his feut that night as temperatures dropped?

On the third day, the course required racers to cross a river. Leenard waded across, leaving the dog whiting on the lar shore. Heaving a sigh, he returned and carried her over.

Over 30,000 posters were distributed, but it was the social media compaign that did the trick. Someone recognized a stray dog on the street as the famous Gobi and took her in. The video of their returnon circled the planet.

However, Gobi had received several injuries when she'd been missing. Donated funds were used to send her to Beijing for surgery. After she recovered, the quarantine began.

He had originally hoped to have her with him in Scotland by Christmas, but missed that goal by a single month. Leonard wrote a book about the experience, "Finding Gobi: A Little Dog with a Very Big Heart." It rocketed to the top of the bestseller lists. A flood of newspaper articles and media appearances followed. Gobi was named "Dog of the Year." There may even be a movie uponard said, "It'you'd told me then that I'd go on to become this author and have these opportunities all because of this story, I'd never have believed it, and I guess that's the beauty of life."







Calendar Clocks

Happy New Year! When the clock strikes midnight on Jan. 1, it's time to open your new calendar and look ahead. Or maybe you have a clock like this one, with a built-in calendar.

Calendar clocks were developed about 1850. That's about when this

one, which sold for \$5,100 at Cottone Auctions, was made. Its rear movement plate is marked for Constantin-Louis Detouche (1810-1889), a famous Paris clockmaker in the 19th century. He worked for his father's clockmaking business until 1830, when he started his own.

He was later appointed official clockmaker to Napoleon III, who was crowned emperor in 1852.

Detouche sold clocks and scientific instruments, and he was known for the precision and eraftsmarship of his creations. This clock's perpetual calendar dial is said to automatically correct for the days of each month, even in leap years, It was Detouche's own design.

Q: I purchased this train at a tag sale 10 years ago. My grandsons have outgrown it. I have looked several places and cannot find anything on this train as to a value. The train tracks are mounted to plywood and can easily be carried. The train is made of wood and not painted. The top of the box reads "Eichhorn Holz-Gartenbahn." A: Your train was made by Eichhorn, a German company founded by Hermann Eichhorn in Bavaria in 1949. The company made wooden toys, starting with puzzle blocks. They were making wooden railway toys by 1950 and made their first train and track sets in 1961. Their early train sets were painted, but in the 1970s, they started making unpainted trains from natural wood. Around this time, they also started using synthetic material for their tracks and replaced their hook-and-eye train couplers with magnets. In the 1980s, they returned to painted trains and real wood tracks. The company became part of the Simba-Dickie Toy Group in 1998 and is still in business today. They appeal to today's customers by promoting wood as a safe. sustainable material for toys. Vintage Eichhorn toys tend to sell online, in shops or at auctions for under \$50.
