



Carson had a host of other interests besides comedy. His love of classic cars began with the 1939 Chrysler Royal that was a cherished family heirloom, owned by Carson's father, and the car Johnny learned to drive in. Johnny was a passionate tennis player, even taking lessons from John McEnroe, for a time. As an accomplished drummer. Carson demonstrated his musical talent occasionally on "The Tonight Show." Carson wrote several books, including his bestselling memoir. Fascinated by astronomy, he became close friends with Carl Sagan, featuring the astronomer on the show several times. Carson also jhad his private pilot's license.

\* Although Carson and many others expected David Letterman to be selected as "The Tonight Show's" replacement host, Jay Leno stepped in as host following Carson's departure in 1992. His first night as host was far from Leno's first appearance on the show. He performed a comedy routine there in 1977 at age 27, and 10 years later became the show's permanent guest host. He remained permanent host from 1992 until 2009. earning four Emmy Awards. Leno announced retirement plans in late 2008, and was succeeded by Conan O'Brien in June, 2009.

In spite of those retirement plans, Leno hosted a new prime-time variety show, beginning that September. In early 2010, with declining ratings, O'brien was no longer the host, and Leno was back in his role at "The Tonight Show," where he remained until 2014. Billy Crystal, who had been Leno's first guest in 1992, was his final guest in 2014.

- \* In 2015, Jay Leno launched a new TV series, "Jay Leno's Garage," a popular automotive show that ran for seven seasons before moving to YouTube. His extensive collection of vehicles includes about 185 cars and 160 motorcycles, with an estimated value between \$80 million and \$100 million. Where are the programs filmed? Where else, but in Leno's garage! But it's not just a garage - it consists of three warehouses spanning about 140,000 square feet.
- \* Jimmy Fallon stepped in as host of "The Tonight Show" in 2014, and is the program's current host. As a child, he loved comedy and music, and sharpened his skills of impersonating others. Serving as an altar boy in his youth led to a desire to become a priest, but he entered college to pursue a degree in Computer Science

He had been hooked on "Saturday Night Live" his entire life, nurturing a vision of one day nabbing a spot on the cast. At 22, he obtained his first audition, which turned out to be unsuccessful. However, a second audition the next year led to the role he had craved and he made his debut in 1998 at age 24. By his fourth episode, he was a star, Letterman," in the same time slot as "The Tonight from his first two positions. He finally settled in as and remained with SNL until 2004.



### STORIES

Baseball hero Jackie Robinson passed away on October 24, 1972 at the young age of 53. This week, *Tidbits* honors this civil rights legend with the facts on his remarkable life.

\* Jack Roosevelt Robinson, the grandson of a slave, was named after President Theodore Roosevelt, who had passed away 25 days before Jackie's birth in 1919. His single mother moved with her five children from Georgia to Pasadena, bases, and the National Leagues's MVP award. The California, where Jackie grew up in poverty.

\* Following his graduation from Pasadena Junior College, Robinson enrolled at UCLA in 1939. While we think of Robinson as a baseball super- \* In the midst of the accolades were the hostile restar, he became UCLA's first athlete to win varsity letters in four sports - baseball, basketball, football, and track. He went 4-for-4 with four stolen bases in his very first UCLA baseball game Robinson was the football team's leading rusher in 1940, and still holds UCLA's record for highest rushing yards per carry in a season. On the basketball court, he led the conference in \*Jackie Robinson's breaking the color barrier led to scoring for two years. In track, Robinson was the NCAA broad jump champion and qualified for the 1940 Olympics, which unfortunately were canceled due to World War II.

\* In 1941, Robinson dropped out of UCLA in order to provide financial assistance for his moth- .311 over 1,382 games. He was inducted into MLB's er. He began playing semi-pro football in Hawaii while also working in construction. He was acquitted and received an honorable discharge, but the incident set him on the path for commitnt to civil rights.

\* The Kansas City Monarchs of the Negro Leagues signed Robinson to play pro ball in 1945. The following year, the Brooklyn Dodgers signed him to play on their minor league team, the Montreal Royals. On April 15, 1947, Robinson debuted with the Brooklyn Dodgers, the first black player in the moern MLB.

\* The 1947 season brought 175 hits, 29 stolen bases, and a .297 batting average, earning Robinson the inaugural Rookie of the Year award. In 1949, his average was .342 with 203 hits, 124 RBI's, and 37 stolen Dodgers were league champions six times during Robinson's tenure from 1947 to 1956, with a World Series win in 1955.

Even his own team members protested, while opposing teams deliberately hit him with pitches and spiked him with their cleats, while spectators threw bottles at him.

\* Robinson retired with a lifetime batting average of Hall of Fame in 1962, the Hall's first black player. Robinson became the first black television sports



October 23 is the day that the swallows depart California's Mission San Juan Capistrano, as they have done since the first documented exo dus in 1812. Tidbits commemorates the day with facts about this old Spanish mission and its famous birds.

\* The mission was founded by Spanish Catholic missionaries of the Franciscan Order in 1776, and named for an Italian priest of the Order. It is home to The Great Stone Church and Serra Chapel, California's oldest building still in use. The original priests' quarters have survived as \*A restoration project at the Mission in the well.


\* In 1812, a 7.5 - magnitude earthquake destroyed the Great Stone Church and bell tower, and the ruins became the perfect place for the mud nests of the American cliff swallows. The swallows leave the Mission every October 23, observed as a day of mourning for the church's Saint Joseph. They embark on their yearly migration to their winter home 6,000 miles (10,000 km) away in Goya, Argentina, flying up to 60 mph (95.5 km/hr), returning on March 19, St, Joseph's

\* In the early 1900s, the migrating birds' return became an annual established traditiion, instituted by Father John O'Sullivan, who maintained his story of contributing to the bird's shelter at the Mission. According to the legend, Father O'Sullivan was walking past a new hotel in the community, and noticed the innkeeper using a long pole to destroy swallows' nests under the structure's eaves. The panicked birds were darting here and there, squealing in terror at the loss of their homes and young. O'Sullivan questioned the proprietor as to where the swallows would go, and received the reply that the dirty birds were a nuisance, he was getting rid of them, and didn't care where they went. The priest spoke to the birds, "Come on, swallows, I'll give you shelter.

\* Father O'Sullivan created a festival for the swallows' return every March to the eaves and stone walls of the Mission, with the townspeople gathering to welcome them.

\* In the 1950s, the number of swallows reached their peak, with an estimated 25,000 birds nesting at the Mission. However by 1970, less than 5,000 swallows were returning. A devastating rainstorm in 1983 flooded the nests, drastically reducing the numbers. Today's population is less than 1,000 birds. Several factors have contributed to the decline, with one major factor being urban development in the area. With the population of San Juan Capistrano topping 35,000, many of the birds' water sources have disappeared. Noise and vehicle traffic have disturbed nesting habits, there are fewer insects to eat, and an increase in predators have all added to the drop.

1990s removed the mud nests from the mission walls, and the birds moved to other areas of town - a nearby housing development, on cliff edges, beneath bridges, and in culverts. An intensive effort is in place to attract the famous feathered friends back to the Mission.







- \* On Oct. 20, 1967, the mythical Bigfoot was believed to have been filmed in northern California, firing the imaginations of numerous enthusiasts. However, when a prominent researcher sent the FBI a supposed hair sample, agents concluded that it was, sadly, of "deer family origin."
- \* On Oct. 21, 1797, the USS Constitution launched in Boston Harbor. A 44-gun U.S. Navy frigate, it was constructed to fight Barbary pirates off the coast of Tripoli, and performed admirably during those conflicts. In 1805, a peace treaty with Tripoli was signed on the Constitution's deck.
- \* On Oct. 22, 1895, a train with a faulty brake tore through the Gare Montparnasse in Paris and out the front before landing nose down in the street. Onlookers purchased train tickets just to see the damage.
- \* On Oct. 23, 1958, Boris Pasternak was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature for "Doctor Zhivago," a romance set during the Russian Revolution and World War I. The book was banned in the Soviet Union, and the Soviet government forced Pasternak to renounce the honor, but his admirers smuggled the manuscript out of Russia in pieces and the CIA helped with distribution behind the scenes. Appearing in numerous translations around the world, it was hailed as a classic, but Pasternak was banished from the Soviet Writers Union, ending his literary career.
- \* On Oct. 24, 1921, in the French town of Chalons-sur-Marne, an American sergeant chose the body of the first "Unknown Soldier" to be honored among the approximately 77,000 American servicemen who died on the Western Front during World War I.

- \* On Oct. 25, 1964, Minnesota Vikings star defensive end Jim Marshall ran 66 yards in the wrong direction into his own end zone after recovering a fumble against the 49ers in San Francisco. Despite the gaffe, the Vikings won. \* On Oct. 26, 1984, 19-year-old John McCollum was found shot to death on his bed in Indio, California. The boy's parents believed that singer Ozzy Osbourne was responsible, because John was listening to Osbourne's alb-

only is she flying by a crescent moon, it looks like the man in the moon is there, too. And the moon rests on the arched back of a black cat. Well, it's a mostly black cat; it appears to be wearing an orange mask. It's definitely the kind Copper, cauldron, fireplace, bail handle, slightly tapered of sight you would see on Halloween night.

Q: I have what I believe to be my great-grandmother's reading glasses. The lenses are small and oval with wire rims and they fold out from a dark metal stick with raised swirls and a purple gemstone. I was wondering if you could tell me what they would be worth and where I should take them.

A: Your great-grandmother's glasses sound like a lorgnette, which is a small pair of glasses with a single han-' dle. They were popular in the late 19th century. Today, they often sell as jewelry. Gray metal (possibly pewter?) swirls and purple stones are all characteristic of art nouveau jewelry, which was at its most popular from the late 1800s to early 1900s; about the same time as lorgnettes.





Art nouveau lorgnettes usually sell for at least \$100. Remember that, like most jewelry, the value will depend on its material. Look for any maker's marks or quality marks; in addition to providing more information, they often raise the value. You may want to consult a local antique shop or jewelry dealer to find out more. Look for one that sells similar pieces; for example, a dealer who specializes in gold jewelry with diamonds may not be interested in or as knowledgeable about a piece like yours. There are also dealers and collectors who specialize in antique glasses.

### Using The VA Home Loan Program

The Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, gave several benefits to veterans coming back from war, including help to buy homes. Within a few years, 2 million veterans took advantage of the program.

Now, in 2025, they've issued the 29 millionth home loan. Since the Home Loan Guaranty program began, the VA has guaranteed \$4 trillion in home loans. Are you ready to buy a home? Your first step will be to get a Certificate of Eligibility (VA Form 26-1880). The COE used for specific VA benefits, such as the home loan or education (Post-9/11 GI Bill). It is your proof of entitlement with details about your service and the benefits you qualify for. The COE confirms to a lender that the VA will back part of your loan. There are several ways to get the COE, but the fastest might be to go online to complete the form. You'll need to log in at ID.me or Login.gov. Once in your account, you'll be able to request your COE, see if you already have one or check the status if you've previously asked for one. See tiny url.com/yrtr5549 to get started.

Or if you're working with a lender who specializes in doing VA loans, they'll be set up to process your COE request. You can also do it by mail: Download the form, fill it out and send it in with a copy of your DD-214. Keep in mind that you still need to pass the lender's scruteny to get a home loan. (The VA's part of the program is to guarantee that the lender won't lose money if you fail to pay the mortgage.) The COE isn't a preapproval or a promise. You'll need to have a good credit history and adequate income. Your current debts will be factored in. To see how your basic entitlement is calculated, go online to www.va.gov/ housing-assistance/home-loans/ loan-limits.

### **Contract Bridge**

Luck evens out in the long run, so if you want to be a winner at bridge, you have to play better than those you play with.

Let's say you're in six hearts and West leads the North-South vulnerable. king of clubs, which you ruff. You play the queen of trump and finesse, but East wins with the king and returns the queen of spades.

It looks as though you must lose a spade trick and go down one, but if you put your gray cells to work, the way to avoid the spade loser emerges. So, you win East's spade return with dummy's king, ruff a club with the ten, re-enter dummy with a low trump to the nine and ruff another club with the jack.

This runs you out of trumps in your hand, since you've ruffed clubs three times and led trumps twice, but that's precisely what you've been trying to do.

You now cross to dummy with a diamond and draw West's last trump with the ace, discarding a spade from your hand. Your K-Q-J-10 of diamonds and ace of spades then win the last five tricks, and the slam is home as your spade loser vanishes into thin air.

To come to 12 tricks, you scored five trump tricks instead of only the four you seemed to have after the trump finesse failed. It might seem odd that to make the slam you must discard your spade loser on one of dummy's trumps, but that's the way things usually go in a dummy-reversal hand. ■ by Steve Becker


