Super Bowl LIX is just around the comer, scheduled for February 9 at New Orleans' Caesars Superdome, the largest fixed dome stadium in the world. This week, Tidbits pays tribute to some of the greatest football players of all time with some on and off field facts.

Former Chicago Bear Dick Butkus had an interesting way of strengthening his legs in preparation for games - he pushed a car up and down the street During his nine-year Bears career, he was invited to eight Pro Bowls. At 6 feet, 3 inches (1.91 m) tall, weighing 245 lbs. (111 kg), Butkus was a force to be reckoned with. It's no wonder he was so "solid" - he weighed 13lbs. 6 oz. (6.1 kg) at birth! As a teen, he worked as a mover for four years. The NFL Network named him the most feared tackler of all time. Post-career, he became a broadcaster and actor, appearing in dozens of films and TV series. His football injuries took their toll on Butkus. One knee was replaced with a metal unit and another surgery left him with one leg 1.5 inches (3.8 cm) shorter than the other, which created distress in his hips, back, and neck. Spinal nerve damage caused trouble with his walking, and he also lost strength in his hands.

He also underwent quintuple bypass surgery. Yet "The Enforcer," as he was frequently called, led a busy life until he passed at age 80 in 2023. (turn the page for more on football's best)

Deion Sanders spent 14 seasons in the NFL, playing for five different teams, but his life hasn't been limited to football. Sanders had been a high school All-Stater in football, basketball, and baseball in addition to his honors as a two-time Super Bowl champ and eight-times in the Pro Bowl, Sanders was a Major League Baseball outfielder for nine seasons with four different teams. He signed to play baseball with the New York Yankees in 1989 and with NFL's Atlanta Falcons the same year. He is the only the athlete to play in both a Super Bowl and a World Series. He's also the only person to hit an MLB home run and score an NFL touchdown in the same week If all of that didn't keep him busy enough, Sanders also had a music career as a rapper, releasing his debut album in 1994. He also served as the host of the 2012 Miss USA pageant. Sanders has been the head coach of the University of Colorado Buffaloes since 2022.

Jerry Rice is regarded by many as the greatest football player of all time. During his career from 1985 to 2004, Rice played in 13 Pro Bowls, four Super Bowls (winning three), and was a Super Bowl and NEL MYP. Rice set 38 NEL records, including receptions, receiving yards, and touchdown catches As the son of abrick mason, Rice developed his hands by catching bricks tossed in his direction on the job. He honed his speed by chasing horses in the pasture until he caught them. Most of his career was spent with the San Francisco 49es (1985-2000), but he spent 2001-2004 with the Caldand Raiders, and dozed out his playing career with the Seattle Seahawks. Rice not only loves football, he adores go ling, and would rise early in the morning before 49ers practice to work on his golf swing.

If Dan Marino had followed his original dream, he would have never achieved football fame. The former Mia mi Dolphins quart ethack got his start in baseball as an outstanding pitcher who also played shorts top when he wasn't pitching. During his high school senior year, his hitting record topped 500. The Kansas City Royals drafted him in the 4" round in the 1979 draft. But although he was a talented baseball player, he was an exceptional football player, chosen for Panade All-American, and made the choice to play just football at the University of Pittsburgh. Marino played 17 seasons with the Dolphins, but never was on a Super Bowl-winning team. He was Rookie of the Year in 1983 and played in the Pro Bowl nine times. Marino still holds nine NFL records. He's been a CBS analyst and continues to act as a special advisor to the Dolphins, but in the 1990s, he branched out into acting, a ppearing in "Ace Ventura: Pet Detective," and opposite Adam Sandler in "Little Nicky." Marino did voicing in a Simpsons episode and appeared in a Hootie & the Blowfish music vide o in 1995. His love of music is evidenced in his ability as an accomplished drummer.

Joe Montana's favorite sport was haske thall, and the Monongahela, Pennsylvania mative was offered several or lege baskethall scholarships before accepting the position of quarterback at Notre Dame, where he graduated with a degree in business administration and marketing. During his 14 seasons with the San Francisco 4Gers, Montana had four Super Bowl wins and was the first player to be named the Super Bowl MVP threetimes. He spent his final two seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, leading the team to its first AFC Championship Game, Joe's surname was Americania-ed from his family's Italian name Montani. He now raises houses and produces wine under the label Montagia in the San Francisco area.

The name stuck in his career with the Chicago Bears, teammates called him Bisouit, referring to "one bisouit shy of 350 pounds." After Clemson, Perry was handpicked by Bears coach Mike Ditka in the first round of the 1965 draft.

In his rookie season, Perry was part of the team that won the Bears' first Super Bowl. Perry holds the record for the heaviest player to score a bouchdown in the Super Bowl, weighing 335 bs (152 kg). His Super Bowl ring was a size 25, compared with the average a dult male's ring size of between 10 and 12. Weighing 13 bs (5.9 kg) at birth, by the time he was 11 years old, he weighed in at 200 lbs. (9.7 kg). At age 54, the weight had really caught up with him when, at 425 lbs. (1928 kg), confined to a wheelchair, Perry was hospitalized for treatment of diabetes, and with no feeling in his feet, was at risk for having his leg amputated.

Within a few months he was living in a retirement home, suffering financial difficulties. He has also been diagnosed with Guillain-Barre Syndrome, an immune disorder that attacks the body's nerves.





In honor of the Super Bowl, Table's invites you to visit Canton, Ohio, the home of the Pro Football Hall of Pame.

In 1961, the community of Canton, Ohio, went all out to ensure that their city would be chosen as the site of the proposed Hall of Fame. They promoted the fact that the NFL was founded there in September, 1920, although at that time it was called the American Professional Football Association. The community instituted a fundraiser that collected almost \$400,000 (\$3.1 million in today's dollars) toward the construction.

Canton was awarded the site and ground breaking or remonies took place on August, 11, 1962. The Hall of Fame opened to the public on September 7, 1963. The original building was just two rooms containing 19,000 square feet of space. Seven years later, construction began on the first expansion, one that would cost \$620,000 and open in May, 1971. This expansion increased the Hall to 34,000 square feet with the addition of one more room. 1977 brought another expansion project with a price tag of \$1.2 million. The gift shop and library were enlarged, and the theater size was doubled, an addition that brought the size of the Hall to 50,500 square feet, more than 2.5 times its original size. The building remained as such until 1993, when a \$9.2 million expansion added a fifth room, increasing the size to 82,307 square feet.

The inaugural class of inductees, agroup of 17 players and executives, was announced in January, 1963. It included Red Grange, who started with the Chicago Bears in 1925 and finished his playing career with the team in 1934, before serving as their coach from 1935 to 1937. Curly Lambeau, co-founder, player, and coach for the Green Bay Packers, and coach of the Chicago Cardinals and Washington. Redskins, was also honozed, along with Jim Thorpe and eight other players.

The Hall's Gallery is home to a bronze bust of each member. Touch-screen knows communicate bios, photos, and videos of each. The Larner Hunt Super Bowl Gallery contains the history of the event from Super Bowl 1 to the present. Championship rings from all the winners are on display. The Lombardi Trophy, the trophy awarded to the winner each year, is on display periodically during the NFL season. It's appropriately named for Packers coach Vince Lombardi, who led the team to victory in the first two Super Bowl games. The selection committee is 50 people, and is comprised largely of media members. The committee meets each year at the time and location of the Super Bowl. Each city with a current NFL team is allowed a representative from the local media. Cities with more than one franchise send a representative for each. Between and four and nine new members are inducted every year.

As of 2004, there are 378 members of the NFL. Hall of Fame. The Chicago Bears have the most inductees, with 39, Green Bay follows with 34, and the Dallas Cowboys, New York Giants, Pittsburgh Steders, and Washington Commanders, each have 32. All 32 active NFL teams have at least one player in the Hall.

The Hall of Fame isn't just for football players. Ho norces include players, coaches, officials, owners, photographers, and even office personnel and groundskeepers – all of those who have made a significant contribution to the game. In order to the nominated for the Hall of Fame, a player or coach must be refired for at least five years. Other contributors can be voted in at any time.


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













































- * On Jan. 27, 1906, Norwegian speed skater Rudolf Gundersen set an impressive world record in a 500-meter speed skating event in Davos, Switzerland, completing the distance in just 44.8 seconds.
- * On Jan. 28, 1917, a maid named Carmelita Torres objected to the chemical delousing frequently given to Mexicans crossing into the U.S. by initially refusing to leave the trolley carrying her and other immigrant workers, then hurling whatever she and her fellow riders could find at American authorities in what became known as the Bath Riots, which lasted through the following day.
- * On Jan. 29, 1958, one of Hollywood's most enduring marriages began in Las Vegas, Nevada, when actors Paul Newman and Joanne Woodward tied the knot. The union lasted until Newman's death from lung cancer in 2008, at the age of 83.
- *On Jan. 30, 1835, Andrew Jackson experienced the dubious distinction of being the first American president to be the victim of an assassination attempt. He clubbed the attacker, Richard Lawrence, several times with his cane and escaped angry but unscathed, thanks to both of Lawrence's guns misfiring, and Lawrence spent the rest of his days in a mental institution.
- * On Jan. 31, 1945, Private Eddie Slovik was shot and killed by a 12-man firing squad in eastern France, making him the first American soldier since the Civil War to be executed for desertion.
- * On Feb. 1, 2003, the Space Shuttle Columbia broke up while entering Earth's atmosphere over Texas, killing all seven crew members. Strangely, worms used in a study by the crew, that were stored in a canister aboard the shuttle, did survive.
- * On Feb. 2, 1897, inventor and businessman Alfred Cralle, a porter at the Markell Brothers drugstore in Pittsburgh, patented the first ice cream scoop, which he called the "ice-cream mold and disher." The Pittsburgh Press reported that the scoop could serve up "40 to 50 dishes of ice cream in a minute," while avoiding "the soiling of the hands." Cralle was the first Black man in Pittsburgh to receive his own patent.




Just Like Cats & Dogs

Coaches felt Johnny Unitas was just too skinny to play football. The 6 ft., 1 in (1.85 m) Pennsylvania native longed to play for the Notre Dame Fighting Irish, but after rejection for the team, he attended the University of Louisville. Out of college, he was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers, but the team released him before the season began, and Unitas, now married with children, went to work in construction, playing to othall on the weekends for a local semi-pro team for \$6 a game. In 1956, when Unitas was 23, he was invited for a workout with the Baltimore Colts. He had to borrow money for the gas but it ended well when the Colts signed Unitas as backup quarterback for the season for \$7,000. He was MVP in 1959, 1964, and 1967, played in the Pro Bowl 10 teams over the course of his 18 seasons, and helped the Colts to win four champions hip titles. His record of most consecutive games with a touchdown pass (47 games) held for 52 years until surpassed by Drew Brees in 2012. Being a football great had its drawbacks for Unitas, who played to otball before heavy padding and other safety features were introduced. An elbow injury led to almost total loss of the use of his right hand, as well as a finger and thumb disfigured from being broken repeatedly. He filed for bankruptcy in 1991. due to a failed business venture.

Emmitt Smith retired in 2004, but he still holds the NFL record for all-time leader in rushing yards with 18, 355, as well as the record for career rushing touchdowns with 164. Smith was drafted by the Dallas Cowboys in the first round of the 1990 draft. In 1993, he became the only running back to win a Super Bowl championship, NFL MVP, NFL rushing crown, and Super Bowl MVP all in the same season.

Walter Payton was certainly a well-rounded high school student, playing baseball, participating in the Boy Scouts, serving at his church, playing drums in the marching band, and singing in the choir. When the football coach tried to recruit Payton for the team, Payton only agreed if he would be allowed to continue in Band. After a college career at Mississippi's Jackson State University, Payton was drafted by the Chicago Bears in 1975, where he remained for 13 seasors, playing in nearly 200 games. During a 19% game against the Vikings, Payton broke the record for the most rushing yards in a single game, with 275, along with a touchdown, all of this accomplished with a 101-degree fewer and a brutal case of the flu. Payton disliked the practice of touchdown celebrations in the end zone, and after scoring, he quietly handed the ball to his teammates or the official. During his post career ventures, including a sports radio show and ownership of a restaurant, Payton's health began to fail and he was diagnosed with kidney failure and bile duct cancer. He passed away in 1999 at the age of 46.

When John Elway retired after a 16-year career with the Denver
Broncos, he had the most victories by a starting quarterback. Yet he
was almost a New York Yankee, selected by the MLB team in the second round of the 1981 draft, and played for a Yankees affiliate during
the summer of 1982, receiving \$150,000 for his efforts. He had already
been selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 1979 MLB draft, but
opted to play football for Stanford University. He made his debut with
the Broncos in 1983.



When the Punishment Does Not Fit the Crime

I had to read the sentence three times before I understood that it really did say what I thought it did: A Department of Veterans Affairs nurse stole pain drugs from dying patients and got a slap on the wrist.

The name was familiar, and I realized that yes, I'd written about this nurse earlier this year when she pleaded guilty to diverting the drugs.

I said at the time that the maximum possible sentence of four years was way too short for the crimes. Specifically, this nurse would take the pain drugs intended for patients in intensive care and only give a partial dose. She would take the rest of the dose herself and falsify the medical records. She did this to one patient alone 19 times in nine days. She even volunteered to care for a certain patient so she could steal his drugs.

The three drugs in question were hydromorphone (which is two to eight times stronger than morphine), fentanyl (which is 50-100 times more potent than morphine and heroin) and oxycodone -- all high-power medications for serious pain. Can you imagine being the patient who needed the pain relief and didn't get it? As someone who once had surgery that required morphine afterward for pain control, I can't imagine the horror of experiencing pain and not getting relief from medication that your doctor has ordered ... because the nurse is stealing it.

And I said at the time, four possible years in prison for these crimes would not be enough.

But now she's finally been sentenced, and what did she get for punishment? Two years of probation. And that's what I had to read three times, because surely it didn't really say that -- except it did. And of that two years, the first six months will be home confinement.

I wish someone would explain to me how hanging out at home for a few months and then being on probation is anywhere near the right punishment for these crimes.

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Animal Hide


The beauty and geometry of snail shells has captured artists' minds for thousands of years.

Q: I have a couple of old scores and cannot find any info on them. Just wondering if they might have any value over the typical \$5 to \$10. They are: a music score/transcript titled "The Miners Dream of Home" sung by Leo Dryden and dated 1892 and "Cavalleria Rusticana -- Potpourri for Pianoforte" by Pietro Mascagni. The only date I can see on it is 1846 but that could be an "originating" date, as opposed to a printing date.

A: One of the major reasons for collecting sheet music, and therefore one of the most important factors in its value, is the cover art. Generally, the smaller the picture on the title page, the older the sheet music. Full pictures were used by the 1870s. Color pictures were introduced in the 1840s, but most 19th-century sheet music had black-and-white cover art. Cover art can also add to the sheet music's crossover appeal, which increases the value. For example, sheet music with a picture of a car on the cover will also appeal to automobilia collectors. A picture of a political figure or event will appeal to political collectors, and so on. To help date your sheet music, check the size. Before 1917, most sheet music was printed on 13 1/2 x 10 1/2-inch pages. After 1920, 12 x 9 inches became the standard size.



Be careful, though: some older sheet music was cut to a smaller size. This lowers its value. "The Miner's Dream of are garden pests, eating plants and oozing slime. And yet they Home" was an English music hall song that Leo Dryden and Will Godwin wrote in 1891. Dryden was the first to perform

> it, and he first recorded it in 1898. Since then, it has been performed as a music hall song, folk song or New Year's song by many other artists, Cavalleria Rusticana, Pietro Mascagni's most famous opera, premiered in 1890. Advertising posters and prints of scenes

from the opera have sold for about \$50 and up at recent auctions, so the sheet music may have a similar value.

The year is off to a roaring start when it comes to scams. To hear the experts tell it, we have AI to thank for a lot of it. AI, or artificial intelligence, is enhancing some of the scams that were already out there and creating more as the technology

Our goal: to get through 2025 without losing a single dollar to the crooks.

Last month the FBI put out an alert focusing on scams created by artificial intelligence and ways to protect ourselves.

- AI-generated text creates fake social media profiles, emails, websites and texts that push financial frauds like investment and romance schemes to trick us into sending money or disclosing personal information.
- \$ AI-generated pictures can include fake driver's licenses or credentials for fake law enforcement. As an indication of how low they'll go, AI can even create fake pictures of natural disasters that tug at our heartstrings and convince us to open our wallets and send money.
- AI-generated audio can impersonate public figures or our loved ones and, again, the purpose is to make us believe something ... and open our wallets.

It's the same with AI-generated videos: to make us believe something is real when it isn't.

No.1 on the FBI's list of ways to protect ourselves is to have a secret word or phrase with family so we can verify our identity. As always, if you're suspicious about a call you receive, hang up. Don't send anyone you don't know any cash or gift cards. Don't post your photos online. If they're online now, take them down. As a start in staying safe from AI, search online for "how to spot AI text" so you can learn to recognize it. Then look for images and audio. Get up to speed on the different ways AI can fool you. Sadly, we need to be wary at all times now.


